### WE WILL REMEMBER THEM

On Remembrance Sunday, November 9<sup>th</sup> services will be held all over the country to remember all those who died in two World Wars and in conflicts around the World since then. They did their duty and gave their lives in the service of their king and country. Two days later, on November 11<sup>th</sup> at11.00 o'clock in the morning there will be further ceremonies to mark the time in 1918 when the guns fell silent.

On November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11.00am there will be a short, simple service led by the rector at Barton church where the lych-gate is dedicated to those who fell in 'The Great War 1914 - 18'

This year has been especially poignant as the country remembered the service men and women who died in the Far East, the Forgotten Army who had to fight on after the war in Europe ended until Japan surrendered.

Why do we do it? Why will some shops ask people to pause and be silent for two minutes in the middle of the morning's shopping at 11.00am on Tuesday the 11<sup>th</sup>? Because it is important to remember, to hold the memory of what was done for us all those years ago. They all fought and gave their lives for our freedom. For the freedoms we take for granted every day, for the things we don't even think about.

Whenever I lead a communion service, in whichever church I find myself, I say these words of Jesus: "Do this in remembrance of me...." Words which he said to his friends around the table at what has come to known as 'The Last Supper'. We are called to Remember, we must not Forget.

Sadly that First World War was not 'The War to End All Wars' as so many hoped. We know that only too well ....... Korea, Suez, the Falkland's, Iraq, Afghanistan the list goes on, as does the duty and service of our young men and women to this day.

Many of us will recognise these words:

When you go home, Tell them of us and say, For your tomorrow We gave our today.

Words from a war memorial in Kohima where so many of 'The Forgotten Army' are buried. There is also a Kohima prayer, almost unknown and unrecognised but which is as much a prayer for us today as it was a prayer for those who gave their lives for us so long ago:

'Ever living God we remember those whom you have gathered from the storm of war into the peace of your presence. May that sense of peace calm our fears, bring justice to all peoples and establish harmony among the nations'. Amen.



### HORNING VILLAGE HALL

Many of you will have noticed the new and larger front door to the Mill Suite – this will enable access, eventually, of wheelchairs and motorised wheelchairs into the Mill Suite via the new ramp. By the time this is published, the insulation of the north side of the Mill Suite will be, hopefully, largely completed. We have commissioned a new internal door to replace the existing, again to allow access by larger motorised wheelchairs, and we are also replacing the somewhat tatty door at the rear of the building.

This work has been made possible by generous grants from the Boshier Hinton Foundation and also from the National Lottery Community Fund. We are extremely grateful to each of these organisations for their generous support which, when the work is complete, will mean that the Mill Suite will be accessible by all sizes of invalid carriage.

We are a little concerned at the floor loading as some motorised invalid carriages are quite heavy, so, for the time being, the number of motorised wheelchairs present in the building will be limited to a maximum of three (3) at any one time.

**HARVEST SUPPER**. It was with great regret we found it necessary to cancel this event because of lack of support. We do appreciate that it was not a good idea to have two significant events on consecutive Saturdays. The trustees are of the view that we should run a Harvest Festival Supper in the village and, if it is not held in the church itself, then clearly the Village Hall is the appropriate venue. We shall be working with the Vicar to select a suitable date for inclusion in the events diary as soon as possible.

**Murder Mystery Evening – 20 September 2025**. A big thank you to HATS for providing a splendid evening of fun, mystery and frolics, and to the Windmill Café team for some excellent food. Thank you too for the "volunteers" from all over the village who rallied round to wait table and even help with washing up! 


