Welcome to Holy Trinity Church, Eckington

Remembering

We are soon going to gather around memorials in our town centres or in our Parish churches to remember. What is it that you are remembering?

I stand before war memorials remembering different things: those who lost their lives in wars, those named on these memorials and those not named, the civilians who lost lives as a result of war; I remember that not all wars are 'just' wars and that sometimes the loss of life is senseless; I remember the impact of war on nature, the flora and fauna of a place. When I walk Bredon Hill in the summer and see the glorious swathes of poppies, I remember how they burgeoned in the churned up fields of Belgium and France in the first World War.

Remembering in the Bible is more than just holding past events, events which may be recent or even several millennia in the past, in our minds and reflecting on them and thinking, "Oh well, that was that." We remember in order to live today upholding faith and values which honour God, people, land. We remember in order to avoid all which devalues God, people, land. Remembering is life-giving, it is using our members, hands and feet and voice among them, to foster life and not death. This is truly godly, holy.

For the Christian all death is a scandal, even though it is natural, part of the 'life cycle'. There is something within us which makes us shake our heads in the face of death, "This is not right," ripples in our consciousness. In the story which unfolds in many voices in the Bible, death is not

meant to have the last word. Jesus' resurrection, that bizarre truth upon which the Christian faith is founded, reinforces this deep sense of death not being OK. This extra ordinary story ripples in our consciousness, synchronized with the sense that death is a scandal. That life is the last word gives us hope and energy to work for all that is life giving. That life will enfold death transforming it, redeeming it, gives us hope.

Alfred Nobel left a lasting memorial of a different kind, a prize. A prize that would enable life-giving action to take root and make a difference in the world in all the spheres of life which impact people most: physics, chemistry, medicine, literature, economic sciences, making peace.

This year's peace prize went to a woman who is striving, at great cost, to promote peace in her country. Dictatorship brought fear, and 'significant social and economic challenges' as one reference coyly put it. God, people, land are not being respected. The Nobel Prize committee have put the spotlight on work which seeks to bring peace. Their investment has no guarantees of success, but it is a powerful sign of faith and hope, a deep conviction that their actions can make a difference, will help to make a difference.

As we gather around our memorials this year. As we hear the words 'never again', the reason these memorials were erected, can we think about the way we use our influence and means to foster life and not death in our worlds.

Eckington Remembers 2025 10:45 Hrs on 9th November

The Royal British Legion will again be participating in a Service at the Cross in Eckington commencing at 10:45 Hrs on 9 November to include the 2 minutes' silence and the 'reading of the names'. The RBL and other Wreaths will be laid as a part of this Service. Anyone wishing to process from the church to the War Memorial is invited to assemble outside the Church on the pavement at 10:40 Hrs, noting for safety purposes that the Road (Church Street) will not be closed until 10:30 Hrs. Wreath layers are invited to join this short procession or to simply join the Wreath Laying Party when it arrives at the Cross. The service will continue in Church from about 11:20 Hrs when the ceremonies at the Cross are complete. You are most welcome to join us.

At 1100 Hrs on the 11th day of the 11th month (on Armistice Day) there will be a further 2 minutes silence, however, the local RBL will limit activity to a reading of names in Pershore Cemetery. If you do not wish to attend this Service (on 9 November) but wish to read the names privately of those who fell from this Parish in the 2 Great Wars (and add anyone known personally to you who has died whilst serving their Country) then you may wish, before reading the names, to use the lines from the poem 'For the Fallen' by Robert Laurence Binyon 1869-1943), first published in The Times newspaper on 21 September 1914:

'They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning We will remember them.'



October meeting had our we extremely interesting speaker Maggi Davis, who gave a very informative talk on the Arts and Crafts movement in The Cotswolds. The Cotswolds became a major centre for the Arts and Crafts Movement between 1890 and 1930. The movement championed traditional craftsmanship, opposing industrial mass-production by promoting handmade goods and fostering a moral crusade to improve society through art and design. Maggi showed us a great variety of items produced during this period such as textiles, wallpaper, glassware, stained glass windows, ceramic tiles and furniture. We were shown a fascinating Victoria and Albert museum video of one of William Morris designed wallpapers, and how it needed 30 hand carved blocks and 15 different colours to hand print a roll of wallpaper. This method could take 4 weeks to complete the finished design. Maggi's finishing thought at the end of her talk was a quote by William Morris "Have nothing in your house that you do not believe to be useful or to be beautiful".

Our Presidents challenge for this meeting was to bring along an 'Arts and Craft' item and we had a remarkable selection of items brought along.



CLIFFORD VAUGHAN

Born in 1937, Clifford was only a small boy when war started. He lived throughout the war as one of a large family of children at the Lock House, on the island at the bottom of Mill Lane. When small in the early part of the war, walking across to Strensham itself was no pronlem, but later barbed-wire was fixed to deter people, effectively blocking access to the Strensham side. When he was small Clifford recalls, there were still the remains of an earlier flour-mill on the island, near to the sluice.

Whenever there was a flood, and there were many, particularly in the winters of the war years, Mr Vaughan, Clifford's father, would get out his punt and row across to just below Jacksons' farm to fill containers with fresh water, a return journey of about threequarters of a mile. Quite often he would have with him Cathy and Shiela, Clifford's elder sisters, as well as Clifford himself. Making his way along the channels which had the hard road beneath the water, he would "beach" his punt on the small rise just below the farm-house, at the gate through which was the well. The track down to the Locks was rough, the hedges tall and there were big elm trees farther up the lane, opposite where Charlie Evans lived, on Fincher's ground. Jack Dance lived in the thatched cottage just above Charlie's.

Clifford remembers the searchlights along at Bredons Norton and around Defford Aerodrome. Dronings of German planes would be followed by searchlights being turned on, and the best view of those was from the Pershore Road going out of Eckington.





Tewkesbury & Bredon Hill Probus Club

There are a good number of car enthusiasts in Tewkesbury and Bredon Hill Probus Club and nearly all of them went on a guided tour of the iconic Morgan Motors Car factory in Malvern Link. Although the factory has been in Malvern since 1910 when it was set up by HFS Morgan, it is substantially the same as it was more than 100 years ago.

At the start we gathered in a presentation area to watch a promotional video about the company and to introduce our two guides who then took us on the factory tour. We viewed the latest models outside, then moved into the storage areas where the all-aluminium chassis are kept before assembly inside the factory itself.

Morgans are built like no other car. For anyone who has visited a modern mass production car factory with frenetic activity and robots assembling the cars and components, the Morgan factory is a revelation. There are no production lines, just individual human beings building cars, often an individual car being built by just one person. I noticed that our guide referred to the operatives building the cars as engineers, rather than assembly workers. His reply to my observation was that other manufacturers just assemble cars, but

Morgan actually builds them.

Despite the age of the buildings, the factory is very clean and the personnel in each of the workshops seem to have a relaxed approach to building the cars and their components. It was astonishing to watch the engineers' skills in manipulating their specific components to ensure a perfect fit. Morgan cars are unique in having an ash frame and it was fascinating to watch skilled woodworkers using hand tools to create the perfect finish of the wood frames all-aluminium before the panels attached.



The last area we visited in the factory was the finishing and testing facility where final preparations are undertaken before the cars are sent to their proud new owners.

This was a memorable visit to a unique company which is still thriving and supplying an exclusive product to many happy customers around the world.

Scams and fraud



It's perfectly normal to feel worried about scams. But our information and advice can help you spot and avoid the latest scams targeting your money.

Phone scams and cold calls

Phone scams are a common way for criminals to con people out of their money.

What are some common types of phone scams?

- Bank scams
- Undercover police scams
- Computer or mobile phone repair scams
- HMRC scams
- Council Tax scams
- Telephone Preference Service scams

- Compensation calls
- Texts with fake links
 - Sales and investment calls
- Phone contract scam calls
- Amazon scam calls
- Fake caller ID

How can I protect myself from scam calls?

- **Say no:** Ignore a caller that asks you for personal information, such as your PIN, or tells you that your computer has a virus. A genuine organisation will never ask you for these details over the phone, in an email or in writing.
- **Report any scams:** Forward unwanted texts to **7726** for free so your mobile phone provider can flag potential scams.
- **Check the line:** Be aware that scammers can keep your phone line open even after you've hung up. Use a different phone, call someone you know first to check the line is free, or wait at least 10 to 15 minutes between calls to make sure that any scammers have hung up.
- **Use an answerphone:** You can use an answerphone on your landline or voicemail on your mobile to screen your calls.
- **Check your calls:** Get a caller ID device to see who's calling. But be aware that some scammers appear as a legitimate number, for example, your bank or utility company.
- **Try call blocking:** Some phones have call-blocking features to stop unwanted calls. If yours doesn't, you can use a separate call blocker. Some blockers come pre-programmed with known nuisance numbers and some allow you to add numbers to that list when you get a nuisance or scam call. You can buy call blockers from various retailers and some local authorities provide them.
- **Cut the cold calls:** Join the free <u>Telephone Preference Service</u> (TPS). This should cut the number of cold calls you receive, though it won't necessarily block all scammers. TPS has a service to stop cold calls to mobile phones too. Go to their website or text 'TPS' and your email address to **85095** to register.
- **Call the company:** If you get a phone call from an organisation asking you for personal information, contact the company directly using a known email or phone number to check the call is legitimate.
- **Avoid links:** If you've received a text asking you to follow a link, don't click on it. If you'd like to check if the text is genuine, contact the company directly either using their official website or phone number and enquire about your account that way.




