

Our Rector writes

Flags, flags and yet more flags!

In recent weeks there has been much talk around our villages and country both in local and in very public conversation about the need for us to take our country back from the thousands of illegal immigrants who have and continue to land on our shores.

In response red crosses have been painted on our roundabouts and St. George's flags and Union Flags have been tied to lampposts and displayed across the nation.

Whether we consider ourselves as being patriotic or a nationalist, or something else, I'd like to share some words from our local Bishops...

"For some, these flags are expressions of shared pride, heritage, and identity. They can symbolise courage in times of struggle, resilience in the face of hardship, and the sacrifices made by those who gave their lives in conflict for the sake of peace. British people of many different ethnic and cultural backgrounds can and do take pride in their national flags; indeed, there is some evidence that the percentage of those who say they are "proud to be British" is higher among those who make up our various immigrant communities than among those born in Britain. They have every reason to be proud as many of them contribute significantly to our communities.

The flags can also be used, for many, as signs of joyful celebration - whether at national sporting events, royal occasions, or community gatherings - moments that bring people together in shared story and memory. There is a long and continuing tradition of flying flags on church towers or outside churches.

Flags are not signs of exclusion but of belonging; not of fear, but of shared history, gratitude, and identity.

The Bible reminds us that "you shall love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt" (Deut. 10:19). Jesus himself was a refugee, carried by Mary and Joseph into Egypt to escape the violence of Herod."

Wherever we are in this current debate, I invite you to consider where we would be if we reversed the roles, if we were fleeing for our lives. Yes, there may be those who are abusing the system and need to be dealt with through the appropriate channels. However, there are many more who are truly seeking a safe place to be, for themselves and for their families. Hospitality is at the heart of true community life. Can we find it in our hearts to extend this to the stranger in need?


