Peace that the world cannot give

Next to St. Margaret's Church in Downham there is a dovecote. The dovecote itself dates back to the 18th Century. It was built in a field of the neighbouring Downham Farm. In 1991 it was moved, brick by brick, to its current location. Dovecotes were built on farms because doves and pigeons were an important food source. Nowadays, pigeons are generally seen as a bit of a nuisance, but doves (especially white doves) are associated with peace. Doves are sometimes released at funerals and weddings; their white feathers representing peace and love.

Peace, like a small dove, can feel like a vulnerable and fragile thing. As I write this article, a ceasefire has just been agreed in Gaza and there is a lot of relief. Yet there is also caution and concern, as to whether aid will reach those who are in need, whether the ceasefire will last, and who will govern that land if this fragile peace does prevail.

In November we remember the Armistice, when peace was declared at the end of World War 1, and also the great cost of the many lives given in two world wars, and subsequent conflicts, in the cause of peace and justice. We will, in each of our villages, gather around the war memorial, to remember by name those who paid the ultimate price so that we may live in peace. Everyday, Christians around the world pray for peace. We pray for peace in Gaza, in Ukraine, in Sudan, in Yemen ... so many places it can be difficult to remember and name them all. Yet we continue to yearn for and continue to pray for peace.

Peace is something that, as the dovecote was, needs to be built up brick by brick to create something sturdy that will last. It also needs a sure foundation. As a Christian, that sure foundation is, for me, Jesus Christ. When he was talking to his friends, shortly before his own violent death, he said, 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14.27) He

gave up his life so that I can be forgiven for my wrongdoings. If I am forgiven, I can forgive others, and that is an essential building block for peace.

We may feel there is little we can do to bring about peace in Gaza, or Ukraine, or anywhere else, but we can do two things: We can pray for peace, and for those on the ground working for peace; and we can be people of peace in our own communities. Seeking to be kind, to see the best in others, and to help others when we can.

And so, as I say during every Sunday service: May the peace of the Lord be always with you.

The poppies of Remembrance Sunday

In late 1914, WW1 erupted across Northern France and Flanders. Great swathes of previously green fields and forests were blasted and bombed, leaving them bleak and barren, with seemingly every living thing destroyed.

But then in the Spring of 1915, something beautiful began to come out of all the destruction. Tens of thousands of bright red Flanders poppies began to put out tentative shoots across the endless vistas of mud. These resilient little flowers had actually flourished in the middle of so much chaos and destruction, because their seeds grow when exposed to sunlight, through disturbances to soil.

We all know that these endless fields of cheerful poppies, growing in the midst of such misery and destruction, were what inspired the Canadian doctor, Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, to write the now famous poem 'In Flanders Fields'.

And it was McCrae's poem which inspired an American academic named Moina Michael to adopt the poppy in memory of those who had fallen in the war. She got it adopted as an official symbol of Remembrance across the United States, and worked with others who were trying to do the same in Canada, Australia, and the UK.

A French woman, Anna Guérin who was in the UK in 1921, caught the same vision, and planned to sell the poppies in London. There she met Earl Haig, the founder of the Royal British Legion, who was persuaded to adopt the poppy as its emblem in the UK.

The Royal British Legion, which had been formed in 1921, ordered nine million poppies and sold them on 11 November that year. Ever since then, the red poppy has been a symbol of Remembrance, of support for the Armed Forces community, and also of hope for a peaceful future.

All in the month of November

It was:

175 years ago, on 19 November 1850 that Alfred, Lord Tennyson, became Poet Laureate of the UK (until 1892).

125 years ago, on 22 November 1900 that Arthur Sullivan, British composer, died. Best known for his collaborations with the dramatist W S Gilbert on operas including HMS. Pinafore and The Pirate of Penzance. He also wrote the hymn Onward, Christian Soldiers.

100 years ago, on 10 November 1925 that Richard Burton, Welsh stage and film actor was born. Known for Cleopatra, Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? And many more. Fifth and sixth husband of Elizabeth Taylor. Died 1984.

Also 100 years ago, on 27 November 1925 that Ernie Wise, TV comedian and actor, was born. Best known for his comedy partnership with Eric Morecambe (Morecambe and Wise) Died 1999.

90 years ago, on 6 November 1935 that Britain's Hawker Hurricane fighter plane made its first flight. It played a major role in WWII, especially during the Battle of Britain.

80 years ago, on 16 November 1945 that UNESCO, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation, was founded.

75 years ago, on 2 November 1950 that George Bernard Shaw, Irish playwright and literary critic, died. Best known for Pygmalion. Winner of the 1925 Nobel Prize in Literature, and co-founder of the London School of Economics.

65 years ago, on 2 November 1960 that a British jury cleared Penguin Books of obscenity for publishing D.H. Lawrence's novel Lady Chatterley's Lover. This is often considered the beginning of the permissive society in Britain.

Also 65 years ago, on 8 November 1960, that John F Kennedy was elected as the 35th President of the USA.

60 years ago, on 9 November 1965 that the death penalty was abolished in the UK

50 years ago, on 3 November 1975 that Britain's first North Sea oil pipeline was officially opened.

40 years ago, on 15 November 1985 that the Anglo-Irish Agreement was signed by the Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and Irish President Garret Fitzgerald. It gave the Irish government a consultative role in the affairs of Northern Ireland.

30 years ago, on 20 November 1995 that Princess Diana admitted that she had committed adultery, and spoke openly about her separation from the Prince of Wales in a frank interview with the BBC. In 2021, BBC journalist Martin Bashir was accused of using deception, including fake bank statements, to persuade her to give the interview.

25 years ago, on 9 November 2000 that Eric Morley, TV host, died. Known for establishing the ballroom dancing competition Come Dancing (1949 – 98). It was succeeded by a celebrity version, Strictly Come Dancing, in 2004.

20 years ago, on 30 November 2005 that John Sentamu became Archbishop of York (until 2020). He was the first black archbishop in the Church of England.

10 years ago, on 13 November 2015 that the Paris Attacks took place when suicide bombers and armed terrorists from Islamic State (IS) attacked a football stadium, rock concert, cafés and restaurants. 130 people were killed and 416 injured. IS said the attacks were in retaliation for French air-strikes on IS targets in Syria and Iraq.

For how many minutes can you concentrate?

Most of us can watch television for only about 15 minutes, or read a book for about 14 minutes, before we lose our concentration. Most of us blame our social media notifications as the reason.


A recent survey by Perspectus Global for Lingo by Abbott, found that Instagram, Facebook, WhatsApp and message alerts were named as the main culprits.

Overall, it seems we can focus for only 11 minutes on a virtual work call, or 13 minutes in a face-to-face meeting, or 12 minutes writing a work email.

We even seem to lose concentration at family gatherings, after only 14 minutes. Overall, four in five of us say that we get distracted easily, and that we lose our focus around eight times each day.

What about you? Why not take up the challenge, and 'time' your losses of concentration for a day?




