Mark 14.1-11

It was two days before the Passover and the festival of Unleavened Bread. The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to arrest Jesus by stealth and kill him; for they said, 'Not during the festival, or there may be a riot among the people.'

While he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment of nard, and she broke open the jar and poured the ointment on his head. But some were there who said to one another in

anger, 'Why was the ointment wasted in this way? For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor.' And they scolded her. But Jesus said, 'Let her alone; why do you trouble her? She has performed a good service for me. For you always have the poor with you, and you can show kindness to them whenever you wish; but you will not always have me. She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for its burial. Truly I tell you, wherever the good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her.'

Then Judas Iscariot, who was one of the twelve, went to the chief priests in order to betray him to them. When they heard it, they were greatly pleased, and promised to give him money. So he began to look for an opportunity to betray him.

Short Reflection

Mark 14:1-11 illustrates a moment of extravagant devotion and its contrast with self-interest. An anonymous woman anoints Jesus with expensive perfume, which some disciples see as a waste, while Jesus declares her action a beautiful and praiseworthy thing that will be remembered forever. The passage highlights how the woman, having understood Jesus's impending death, acts in love, while Judas's criticism reveals his own greed, ultimately foreshadowing the betrayal that follows.

- Extravagant devotion: The woman's act is one of pure, selfless love, preparing Jesus's body for burial even before he has died. Her gift is costly, representing all she has, but it is not a calculation of what is "decently" owed—it is an overflowing expression of devotion.
- Critique and greed: The disciples' anger at the "waste" of the perfume stems from a misunderstanding of who Jesus is and his purpose. Judas's concern for the poor is a pretext for his own greed, as he sees a financial opportunity that he can exploit.
- Jesus's affirmation: He elevates her selfless act over the more practical but less devotional gesture of giving to the poor, emphasizing that his own presence is a unique and limited time.
- The truth of the heart: The woman's devotion is based on her deep understanding of Jesus, while the disciples' criticism shows their lack of it.
- A model for discipleship: Her story reminds believers that true devotion is not about what is practical but about responding to God's love with generosity and sacrifice, and that nothing given to God in love is ever wasted or forgotten.
- Foreshadowing betrayal: The contrast between the woman's act of love and Judas's betrayal is stark, a powerful foreshadowing of the events to come.

 The "Good News": The story is considered "Good News" because it offers an example of how to respond to Jesus's love, and because Mark includes it in his gospel, it is a story of authentic discipleship that will be told for generations.

Send us out this week, united in praise and service. Fill us with enthusiasm and joy, increasing and confirming our faith in you, that through us, those we come into contact with may come to Christ to be cleansed and healed.
