Dear friends

We live in an age of the direct cremation. This is when there is no funeral service of any kind and has resulted from a heavy marketing campaign, which has persuaded increasing numbers of people that this is the best way to handle final matters. However, all my instincts and pastoral experience suggest that it causes more problems than it solves. Funerals, of course, are for the living not the dead. Direct cremation removes the opportunity for families to grieve. The gap that is left in people's lives after a loved one dies is huge, but even greater for there being no occasion to properly mark the passing. I have recently come across several people who have been powerfully distressed by this lack of opportunity to grieve. I know that many believe they are being kind to their loved ones by saving them money and trouble over funeral arrangements, but this is nothing compared to being deprived of an occasion to mourn. We do grief badly in this country (the English stiff upper lip is not our friend), and this in my view makes it worse.

It is perhaps as well that Lazarus wasn't cremated, or we wouldn't hear of Jesus weeping at his graveside (John 11).35. If it was good enough for Him, it is vital for us.
