The last time there was a new archbishop (2013) it wasn't possible for women to be bishops in the church of England. That vote came in 2014 and slowly more women were appointed as bishops. At the time there were dire predictions of the end of the Church of England.. and whilst that is still a very real possibility, I personally don't think it wil be anything to do with allowing women to answer their God given vocation. And that is what it is. Answering a vocation. Meaning that the whole appointment process is one of discernment.. a discernment of God's will promted by the Holy Spirit. Perhaps that is one reason for the lengthiness of the process.. discernment cannot be rushed .. it is for us to wait on God's Spirit not the other way around.

The appointment is undoubtedly controversial and there are many in the Angican Communion that will not be able to accept this change. Whatever happens, it is for us as Christians in this place to stay faithful to the Good News of Jesus Christ, to stay prayerful and attentive to God working in our world, to be gentle and compassionate and to serve one

another as Christ served us.

The vocation of leadership is a tough one to answer and often a lonely one. Please pray for Archbishop Designate Sarah and her family, that as she offers herself to the Church in this way, we may journey together in faith, hope and love that the Church and that world may come to know the peace of God which passes our understanding.
