Today's hymns are...

337 Morning has broken

Back in 1931 Eleanor Farjeon wrote the words for this beautiful hymn which uses a Gaelic melody which we have used for our Christingle carol. Cat Stevens. Neil Diamond and Roger Whittaker have recorded versions.

514 Thou whose almighty word

This is a hymn that praises God for his light, both physical and spiritual. It was written by John Marriott, an English minister's son, in the early 19th century. Initially it refers to the creation story in Genesis and then asks us to take his light into the dark places of His world.

310 Lord for the years

One of the 20th century's finest hymns, it was written by Rev Timothy Dudley-Smith who also gave us *Tell out my soul*. It was written for the centenary of the Children's Special Service Mission. Originally sung to *Finlandia* it is now inseparable from Bishop of Chester Michael Baughen's composition.

153 Give me joy in my heart

The author of this joyous hymn is unknown but it has long been popular. "Sing Hosannah" means to express our admiration and praise of God.
