People of faith Samson Part 2

Samson's great strength had been demonstrated when he was in Gaza. The people plotted to kill him but, in the middle of the night, Samson took hold of the doors of the city gate and carried them to the top of a hill outside the city [Judges 16: 3]. Samson later fell in love with a Philistine woman called Delilah. She was asked by the Philistine leaders to find out the secret of Samson's great strength and was promised huge riches. [Judges 16: 5]. Samson tied to avoid telling Delilah by specifying being tied up by new bowstrings or new ropes and to have his hair woven into the fabric on the loom. All failed to reduce Samson's strength [Judges 16: 7-15] Eventually Delilah's persistence paid off and Samson told her that his strength was a result of his Nazarite vow to the LORD which included not cutting his hair. As Samson was sleeping, one of the Philistines came in and cut his hair and Samson's strength left him as the LORD left him. When Samson awoke, the Philistines came and subdued him, gouged out his eyes, bound him in chains and put him to work grinding grain in the prison. The Philistines held a great gathering to offer sacrifice to their god Dagon

and to celebrate their victory over Samson. They brought Samson out to be a source of entertainment. Samson asked to be guided to the main support pillars of the building. What the Philistine leaders had not realised was that while Samson was in prison, his hair had started to re-grow. He called on the LORD to strengthen him one last time to gain revenge on his captors for his eyes. As Samson pushed on the two pillars with all his might, the roof of the building collapsed killing Samson and all the three thousand or so people in the building. [Judges 16: 23-31]
