First Reading: 2 Timothy 1:1-14

¹Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, for the sake of the promise of life that is in Christ Jesus, ²To Timothy, my beloved child: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

³I am grateful to God – whom I worship with a clear conscience, as my ancestors did – when I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. ⁴Recalling your tears, I long to see you so that I may be filled with joy. ⁵I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that lived first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, lives in you. ⁶For this reason I remind you to rekindle the gift of God that is within you through the laying on of my hands; ⁷for God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline.

⁸Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, relying on the power of God, ⁹who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace. This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Saviour Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹²and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.

Canticle

Intercessions

To the words: With the disciples, we say to the Lord:

Please respond: 'Increase our faith.'

Faithful God,

we pray for those of your people who are hanging on to faith in you by their fingertips, while the everyday securities of life collapse around them.

We pray: for those, like the people of Judah,

who are strangers and exiles far from home;

for those who are exiled from normality by illness, anxiety, or bereavement; for those estranged from people they love by the breakdown of relationships of trust.

Silence

With the disciples, we say to the Lord: 'Increase our faith.'

Faithful God,

we pray for those of your people whose faith is weakening and dying, tested beyond endurance by the pain of living.

We pray: for those who, like the early Christians

are persecuted and penalized for their beliefs;

for those whose belief in the power of love has been shattered by the suffering of an innocent loved one;

for those who have sought you in the church but found little wholeness there.

Silence

With the disciples, we say to the Lord: 'Increase our faith.'

Faithful God, we pray for ourselves for the times when our faith remains a duty but has lost its delight. We pray for the gift of your life-giving Spirit.

Silence

With the disciples, we say to the Lord: 'Increase our faith.' that we may serve you forever, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Collect

Lord of creation, whose glory is around and within us: open our eyes to your wonders, that we may serve you with reverence and know your peace at our lives' end, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Lord's Prayer

Rejoicing in God's new creation, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Conclusion

The Lord bless us, and preserve us from all evil, and keep us in eternal life. Amen.
