#### Dear friends,

I was in Long Mountain School recently and heard that they had been marking International Dot Day. The children had spent some time hearing and reflecting on a book called *The Dot*. It tells the story of a little girl called Vashti who thinks she is no good at drawing. Her teacher tells her, 'just make a mark and see where it takes you', and so she makes a dot on the page. The teacher frames the dot and displays it in her office, and this encourages Vashti to draw more and more wonderful and colourful paintings.

This story reminded me of Jesus' parable of the mustard seed. The seed is not chastised for being small and insignificant, and it grows into a tree so big the birds can nest in its branches. Jesus does not scold us for the little faith we have. Instead he encourages us just to plant a seed, just to put a mark on a page, just to trust in him a little, and then God can do amazing things in and through us. Where could you make your mark this week? In a conversation, an act of kindness, or a prayer?

As Hudson Taylor, the 19<sup>th</sup> century missionary to China wrote, we do not need a great faith, but we do need a little faith in a great God.
