LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION DRAWS CLOSER

In a previous article I wrote about the government's changes to the whole way local government works. In brief:

- A number of powers will be devolved to local regions, each governed by a mayor.
 We will be electing our mayor in the spring of 2026.
- The councils in our current two-tier system (county and district) must merge to form unitary councils.

The County Council told us right from the start that we need one council for the whole of Suffolk. The District Councils started by asking us whether there should be one, two or three unitary councils for Suffolk. Both consultations heard overwhelmingly from Suffolk people that "local" really does mean local, with two or three councils required.

The Parish Council debated the matter and also came to the unanimous conclusion that having a single Suffolk council would not help East Bergholt. Our current experience with the County Council on matters such as highways and special education needs is that its officers listen neither to us nor to our hard-working County Councillor.

The Parish Council therefore voted unanimously to say "no" to the idea of a One Suffolk unitary council.

Babergh District Council, however, has helped a number of local initiatives and its members support the idea of multiple unitary councils, although they are split on whether two or three councils would balance the rural and urban areas best.

The recommendations going to government from the councils, due by 26th September, are as follows:

- The County Council will recommend One Suffolk, a council which would be twice as big and powerful (and remote) as the county council currently is. One Suffolk would cover more than 760,000 people, managing all the services that both tiers of councils currently manage, with perhaps 120 councillors. We would lose our local village councillor representation.
- The combined District Councils will recommend three Suffolk councils, with approximately 255,000 population and perhaps 90 councillors per council. East Bergholt would fall into the greater Ipswich area, along with Hadleigh, the Shotley peninsula, greater Ipswich and Felixstowe. If there are 90 councillors it is probable we could retain our own councillor.

The Parish Council commend the second option (three councils) to you. We believe it is more likely that we can represent your views effectively to a smaller council with more time to listen to your proposals. A decision by government is expected in 2026. - *Joan Miller, chair, East Bergholt Parish Council*







After six years our distribution coordinator is leaving for a well-earned retirement and we are now looking to replace her.


This is a voluntary role. The main duties involve:

Gardening tips for October

October already. Days are shortening and summer sunshine is slipping away. Time in our gardens is less, but there is still plenty to do putting our gardens to bed for winter. For weeks now, leaves and acorns have been falling. Keep raking - it's good exercise! The rain we had, at last, in early September will probably mean lots of weeds germinating too.

If you haven't bought bulbs for inside and out, don't delay. Plant daffodils, tulips and alliums for a spring display. Protect them from squirrels; they stock up on food for winter and bulbs are a "delicacy". Small-mesh chicken wire will provide protection until foliage appears.

Plant up winter tubs, containers and baskets with plants of your choice. Garden centres are full of suggestions. Shorter daffodils such as Tete-a-Tete and Jetfire are best. Sweet peas can be sown in frames, greenhouses or pots on a sunny windowsill. Now is an ideal time to plant or move trees and shrubs. Hedges can be planted too.

Deadhead late-flowering herbaceous plants. Toward the end of the month, roses can be reduced in height to prevent wind rock. Check all fence posts are secure, and it's a good idea now to protect outside taps against freezing up.

On the veg plot, broad beans can be sown, and also garlic bulbs. Remaining tomatoes may ripen; if not, try making some chutney. Remove straw around strawberry plants to increase ventilation and cut back old foliage to encourage new growth. Cut back raspberry canes too. Lawns may need mowing with cutters slightly raised. Perhaps some of the grass could do with a top dressing of John Innes No. 3 loam-based compost.

Gosh, this year has sped by. With all its challenges, I hope you have enjoyed summer in your gardens. Perhaps you are planning some changes for next year, or resting on your laurels? One last thing: birds. - *Janet Alcoe*







Recycling small electricals: It is not a good idea to put small electrical items into the black bin, because they can be recycled if they cannot be repaired. Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils have launched a new recycling scheme for electrical items.

New pink recycling bins can found in the two districts for electrical items like kettles, mobile phones, tablets, and anything smaller than a four-slice toaster.

Babergh has six bins; our nearest is at Magdalen Road car park in Hadleigh. There is also one in Manningtree Library.

New plan for housing Babergh's homeless: As of March

2025, Babergh and Mid Suffolk councils were housing a total of 158 households in emergency accommodation, including women and children fleeing domestic abuse and vulnerable adults with complex needs who might otherwise be sleeping rough.

Temporary housing is a short-term measure which allows our housing team to find long-term accommodation. Babergh is good at preventing homelessness but there are always emergencies.

The cost of this temporary accommodation has risen hugely. Demand for temporary accommodation has increased in Babergh by 69% between the 2020-2021 financial year and 2024-2025. This has led to both councils increasingly relying on B&B and hotel accommodation, costing in the region of £70,000 each month.

The situation is unsustainable, so Babergh and Mid Suffolk cabinets have decided to invest in 30 new properties for each district over the next few years, to be used for temporary emergency accommodation. In the long term this will cut the costs of accommodation and will provide better-quality housing.

UPDATE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

At our September meeting we welcomed Henry Fairbanks, director of acquisitions and wholesale for The Chestnut Group, who outlined plans for The Red Lion and answered residents' questions. Chestnut, which operates pubs, hotels, a wine company and a

brewery across East Anglia, has purchased the pub, the land to the rear, and the car park. Henry, who lives locally, said the group has been warmly received and thanked the village for its support.

Responding to feedback, Chestnut has reinstated the pub's original name, reopened the right-hand bar as a true public bar (no bookings), and confirmed it will remain dog-friendly. An experienced general manager is in post and local staff have been recruited. Food will develop gradually, and further plans include the possibility of bedrooms at the rear of the site. A tipi will be added this winter to increase dining space.

The car park will remain leased to the Parish Council. Chestnut confirmed that any future planning applications for the rear land would be for bedrooms only.

The Council has received concerns about proposed EV charge points at Foxhall Fields, especially given limited parking. Current EV owners there already have private chargers. While supporting the principle of more charging infrastructure, we believe community input is essential. We have contacted Suffolk County Council and County Councillor Hall to request consultation before any decisions are made, and will update residents.

Speeding remains a concern in parts of the village. To raise awareness, we are launching a campaign following successful local examples, where schoolchildren design "Don't Speed" posters. Thanks to support from Grier & Partners, these will be printed on estate agent-style boards. The Council has also approved, in principle, the use of the central village car park for a **Christmas Market on Saturday 6**th **December.** This event will replace the parade and market usually held at Gandish Road, which is not taking place this year. - *Nicki Reed*

It maps the whole world into a grid of 3m x 3m squares, with each square identified by three words. For example, I'm currently sitting

at my desk at Hadleigh Police Station, and the three words linked to where I am are sniff.nylon.suits.

The emergency services now use this tool all the time. Anyone calling 999 can tell the operator the three words for their location, and help can be sent. - PC Katie Jarrett

UK agriculture has traditionally been a male-dominated sector, with farm succession often favouring sons over daughters. However, the non-profit Succession Alliance says this is now changing as women increasingly assume pivotal roles, not only as supportive family members but also as primary decision-makers.

Defra says the risk from avian influenza continues to rise, particularly in coastal counties such as Norfolk and Suffolk which are on bird migration routes, and parts of the country with a significant game-bird industry.

Pig and poultry industry representatives have rejected claims made by The Wildlife Trusts that the sectors are having a negative impact on the countryside, water quality and pollution, reports Farmers Weekly.


