
Here is the third in our series of **Jewish festivals**. Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) took place on 2 October this year. On this important day, Jews attend synagogue and pray for forgiveness from God; and to put right any wrongs they have committed against others. You undergo a 25-hour fast, the only fast prescribed in Jewish scriptures. Jews who do not observe any other religious customs often participate on this day. So no food, no drink, no sex, no leather shoes. People spend the spend the eve of Yom Kippur and the next

day in prayer and meditation. The Kol Nidre is recited in which you give up all vows or promises made in the previous year. Interestingly the Kol Nidre is in Aramaic, the language of Jesus, not Hebrew. Friends ask and accept forgiveness from one another for past offenses on the evening before Yom Kippur. God is believed to forgive the sins of those who sincerely repent and show their repentance by improved behaviour and performance of good deeds. This is followed by

Sukkot or the Feast of Tabernacles, a seven-day holiday beginning on 7 October and rooted in



the 40 years the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness. During Sukkot, Jews construct and decorate a temporary shelter called a sukkah. A special prayer ritual requires the use of an etrog (a citrus fruit) and lulav made up of a palm frond, hadas (a myrtle sprig), and arava (a willow



branch). The festival ends with Simchat Torah ("Rejoicing of the Torah"), during which the Torah scrolls are carried around the synagogue to express the joy of receiving and observing God's law. During the course of the festival, practitioners are encouraged to spend ample time in the sukkahs, eating their meals there and possibly even sleeping there. Many of our neighbours have sukkahs in their back gardens.

Prayers We pray for our neighbours in the Jewish community after the appalling events at Heaton Park Hebrew Congregation synagogue last Thursday morning. Bishop David says: "I am deeply shocked and saddened by this violent incident. My thoughts and prayers are with all those affected – the victims, their families, and the wider Jewish community – especially on the sacred day of Yom Kippur. Such acts of violence have no place in our communities. Manchester is a city built on diversity, mutual respect, and unity....Hate can never defeat hate, only love can conquer hate. Today, we stand in solidarity with our Jewish neighbours and reaffirm our shared commitment to peace and safety for all. I commend the swift response of the emergency services and offer my full support to those working to bring healing and justice in the wake of this tragedy. Let us continue to pray for the dead and injured, for the community in grief, and for the courage to stand together against hatred in all its forms."
