The Word of God

Psalm 46

¹God is our refuge and strength, ♦ a very present help in trouble;

²Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, ♦ and though the mountains tremble in the heart of the sea;

³Though the waters rage and swell, ♦ and though the mountains quake at the towering seas.

⁴There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, ◆ the holy place of the dwelling of the Most High.

⁵God is in the midst of her; therefore shall she not be removed; ◆ God shall help her at the break of day.

⁶The nations are in uproar and the kingdoms are shaken, ♦ but God utters his voice and the earth shall melt away.

Brothers and sisters: ¹¹May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, ¹²while joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

¹⁵He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; ¹⁶for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers – all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. ¹⁹For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ²⁰and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

Lord, hear our prayer.

We pray for those whose commitment to truth brings them into conflict with earthly powers, that they may have the courage to endure.

May your rule come; Lord, hear our prayer.

We pray for this community of faith, that attentive to your word we may always worship in spirit and in truth.

May your reign come;

Lord, hear our prayer.

Loving God,

you have taught us that the power of the heart is greater than the power of wealth and might. Hear us as we pray for the fulfilment of your reign.

We ask this through Jesus Christ our King; to him be glory and power for ever. Amen.

Collect

God the Father, help us to hear the call of Christ the King and to follow in his service, whose kingdom has no end; for he reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, one glory. **Amen.**
