New, but Old...

I've been thinking about names a lot recently, particularly name changes.

There are many incidents in the Bible of God calling someone by a new name to represent a change of circumstance or calling. One of my favourite examples from the Old Testament is Sarai, the wife of Abraham; God changes her name from Sarai which means 'my Princess', to Sarah which means 'Princess to the Nations'. This name change comes after God blesses her and her husband with the birth of their child, Isaac, when they were well into old age. The lineage of Christ can be traced back through Isaac to Abraham. Sarah's subtle change of name marks her role in the story.

Perhaps most famous of all is Peter, formally known as Simon. Jesus changes his name to Peter, which means 'The Rock', which recognises that Peter's faith is foundational in building the church. Did you know that there is a tradition of ordaining new priests at the end of June, a season known as Petertide, when we remember and celebrate Peter's ministry. In the book of Isaiah 49:16, it says, "Behold, I have inscribed you on the palms of My hands", a sign of God's personal and permanent care, symbolising that his people are never forgotten, and their identity is marked on him in much the same way as a tattoo. A reminder that God knows more than just our name, he recognises our identity.

A name change usually marks something significant happening; the formalising of a relationship through marriage or civil partnership or marking a new identity in some way.

The keen eyed among you might have noticed that my surname has recently changed, this following the ending of my marriage and a decision I have taken to return to using my family name, Clarke.

Perhaps you have had reason to change your name, and I doubt you did it lightly; it can follow a time of upheaval and discomfort, but the words from Isaiah remind us that God knows us intimately, and loves us regardless.

Hopefully for most of us a change of name, however discombobulating the process might have been, usually marks the beginning of something new, a step in the right direction, a new identity and a nod to the future.

So for the first time I'll sign off with my "new but old" name: Reverend Anna Clarke
