From the Vicarage Dear Friends,

As the days grow shorter it is natural we should seek the light, a flickering candle, the riotous displays of bonfire night, or the dazzling floats of Carnival.

In Alham Vale our church month begins with a reflective service called *These We Have Loved*, where we light candles to remember loved ones now departed. The month ends with the first Sunday of Advent, when the first candle on the Advent wreath is lit. *These We Have Loved* offers a quiet supportive space to sit with our memories and our grief. It is a gentle service of readings and



hymns followed by refreshments. It will take place at St Peter's Church, Evercreech, at 4pm on Sunday 2nd November. All are welcome. Advent Sunday marks a time of watching and waiting as a star leads us towards the newborn Prince of Peace. Advent is a season for self-reflection and for considering our own lives, relationships and values in the light of the Christian message of hope, peace, joy and love.

On Sunday 9th November churches everywhere will mark Remembrance Sunday, when we pay tribute to the sacrifices made by many to ensure our peace, and whose lights were often snuffed out too soon. This year on Saturday 1st November the Somerset County Royal British Legion will hold the Somerset Festival of Remembrance 2025 at Wells Cathedral, commemorating 80 years since the end of the WWII. This occasion will honour the courage, resilience and sacrifice of Somerset's people during WWII, and tell the story of ordinary people doing extraordinary things to keep the light shining when the darkness of fascism threatened to engulf Europe.

In today's unstable world I find comfort in a gospel message which speaks of justice, peace and loving your neighbours. On 3rd October Bishop Sarah Mullally was made Archbishop designate. Her task will be to lead the Anglican Communion through these turbulent times. If you are the praying kind please pray for her.

"God our Father, Lord of the church, we thank you for calling Sarah Mullally to be our new Archbishop. We thank you for her willingness to respond to your call, and pray that you would pour upon her the strength, wisdom and vision that she needs as she leads and serves us. May we in turn commit to praying for Archbishop of Canterbury-designate Sarah and her family, that you would bless and protect them, and enable your church to walk together under her leadership in grace, unity and love. We ask this through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Organ and Sound Appeal

This summing up article, by its nature must have many a thank you, so please indulge and forgive me as there are so many people that have hugely contributed in so many ways to the appeal.



It does not seem all that long ago that I and 10 others agreed at a PCC meeting in September 2024 to take on the task of raising the money needed for the renovation of the Organ and updating of the sound system in Church. It seemed a very tall order back then to try to raise £30,000 but we put together a plan with a start and finish date and off we went. I cannot thank the team enough for their commitment,



energy, enthusiasm, ideas, complimentary skills, generosity and humour throughout the whole period which has made it fun and very enjoyable. I would like to thank them personally, so thank you, than

and Jolyon for agreeing to help back in September – you have all been amazing.

The real stars of the show though are our community – all of you – we have been amazed at how generous people have been both with their money and their time, so our thanks go to you all. Little did we know when we started in February with the launch of the appeal and handing out of the Talents what a summer of wonderful social events and fun we would have. People have sponsored organ pipes, run events such as cream teas, BBQ's, Pimms and Jazz evenings, table top sales, cycled many miles, knitted, sewn, cooked, painted, made lemon curd, jam and bird boxes to name but a few and I apologise to those who have done things that I have missed.

I must also mention the music and how lucky we are to have such wonderfully talented musicians, living locally, who have been willing to give their time, completely free, to entertain us and help us so much in this cause. The launch event cheese and wine party in February gave us a taster but the grand finale concert gave us time to sit, enjoy and marvel at just how good you all are.

Local businesses have also been very generous giving raffle prizes and Mendip Renewables Ltd (who own the solar farm in Pylle) agreed to match fund us up to £10,000 which we were extremely grateful for and meant the total felt much more obtainable. We were also able to obtain a small grant towards the work on the organ.

When we started the fundraising, I was told to have faith and recall the verse in Matthew 7:7-8: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find." Well, we did ask and we did seek and the great people in the Parishes of Evercreech and Milton Clevedon did not disappoint – so thank you so much again from the bottom of my heart because not only did we raise the £30,000 we smashed it and to date including the grant have raised £36,613.

So, the organ restoration work is booked in for the spring and we are out at other churches listening to wonderful sound systems and we will update you when we have jumped through all the hoops to get that project started too. So thank you again and may God bless you all.

Living the story. Telling the story.

Let's walk into the light

A story that's often told in our churches comes from the fourth chapter of John's Gospel. It tells of Jesus, in the blinding heat of midday meeting a Samaritan woman at the well in a town called Sychar. The woman is hoisting up heavy buckets of water in the hot sun. She's there because she's

a woman with 'a reputation' and it's the only time of day she can avoid the muttering of her neighbours who meet at the well at cooler hours.

In an extraordinary encounter, Jesus sees deep into the woman's heart. Through their conversation Jesus brings about her healing and restoration into the community from which she is estranged. It's a story of life, possibility, new beginnings and forgiveness.

The woman at the well is not the only Biblical story set in Sychar. There's another, contained in the 34th chapter of the Book of Genesis. This is a tale of terror that's never heard in our churches; the rape of a girl called Dinah. It's a dark, nasty tale of violence that wrecks the life of individuals, families and the entire community. So we don't speak about it. We keep it hidden.

Sometimes people say to me of safeguarding 'It's just a tick box exercise', an onerous compliance requirement. Rather I would say that our work in safeguarding asks fundamental questions about the kind of places we want our churches to be. Just like the Bible passages I've mentioned, we can be places of hiddenness, silence, and hurt. Or places of life, new beginnings and restoration.

Accounts like the Makin review have shone light on our story. We've also been working hard to bring about change. While we cannot be complacent, I am intensely proud of all that was revealed about safeguarding in Bath and Wells by our independent audit that happened earlier this year. This told us that we are moving towards a much better story. So let's build on the momentum we have created. Let's walk into the light.

In England, our journey has taken us from the ordination of women as priests in 1994 to the consecration of our first woman bishop in 2015. Now the first woman will serve as Archbishop of Canterbury and her appointment will change our Church and the whole Anglican Communion forever.

"I and all of us in Bath and Wells, will be praying for Sarah, Eamonn and their family as Sarah prepares to take on this role."







Unfortunately we were unsuccessful with our bid to the Co-Op Community Fund to help replace the clock. We will be launching a fundraising appeal shortly.



The Village Cross Preaching Stone: Repairs to the cross have begun as planned, and the unstable upper cruciform section has been successfully removed, revealing (as expected) a heavily corroded iron dowel which has expanded, putting pressure on the surrounding masonry causing spalling and deterioration. The next stage involves tackling the embedded ironwork which requires careful removal to minimize damage to the surrounding stone. The rod will be replaced with a steel dowel as per best practice. The base has also been carefully weeded and repointed during this initial phase of work.



Cemetery: We are conducting a Topple test in the Cemetery, so please don't be alarmed if you see a councillor leaning or pushing headstones. It is a requirement to test the stability of them every so often. The Path affected by roots from a large Cedar tree will be dealt with. A tree specialist will deal with the roots, then groundworks will be commissioned to repair the path.

Queens Road Playing Field: New bins have been ordered, and essential maintenance has been commissioned.

The council would like to show their appreciation to all the work that Susan Ehmann is doing as a volunteer Bus Representative. Although we still have a vacancy for a co-opted councillor, Volunteering is another way to get involved and make a difference in the community. Redwings on the wing

Throughout Autumn something special is happening in our night skies. Huge numbers of redwing are migrating from Northern European forests, which empty of most bird species before winter strikes. Coming from Scandinavia and Russia they migrate into the UK, Ireland and western France. Bird books describe the redwing call as *seeih* and once you have learned it, you may hear a redwing call overhead every few minutes, wherever you are in the UK, as they pass over in a wave of birds. There are a few pairs (about 80) of redwing breeding in Scotland but really, they are a winter visitor to our shores.

Redwings are a small thrush, of similar size to our song thrush but with darker brown plumage and the characteristic flash of colour from the red feathers on their under-wings as they fly. Look out for them feeding in the churchyard, you may be seeing birds fuelling up on migration or winter visitors who will stay for a few months. Redwings feed on berries, fallen fruit and will find soil invertebrates in short grass, pulling up worms or digging out leather jackets. They can be seen in flocks, with other thrushes such as fieldfare, mistle thrush and song thrush, feasting on yew berries and making a real mess! Winter thrushes descending on churchyard yews is one of the sights that chart the changing seasons.

You can help redwing and other thrushes by providing berry bearing shrubs and trees and thinking of your hedges as larders for weary travellers. Leave hedges

untrimmed until February or early March so that birds may shelter within them and feed on hedge fruits such as hawthorn berries. Churchyards are usually free of pesticides which allows soil invertebrates to thrive, providing lots of nutritious meals. Yew trees provide both food and shelter and also give us the opportunity to really look at these lovely birds and think about the long journey they have made to reach us.


