

We fear that we live in a world of increasing polarisation. Conflicts between and within nations play their The amplification of division part. hostility by media and social algorithms doesn't help. Culture wars exacerbate matters further. Sometimes it feels like common is disappearing ground underneath our feet like a sandbar being overwhelmed by the tide.

In such a climate, it's good to return to the message that heralded the arrival of Jesus. 'I bring you tidings of great joy which shall be for all people' Christmas says that angel who announces the joy for all saviour's birth (Luke 2: 10). Jesus' story quickly people includes all types and sorts of humanity. From local shepherds to exotic visitors from afar. I wonder what the conversation was like as they all crammed into the stable to see the newborn child?

Jesus's story quickly shows that not only is he <u>for</u> all people but that he <u>needs</u> all people. His family must have needed assistance when they fled as refugees to Egypt. Jesus must have needed help when his parents left him behind on a family outing to Jerusalem aged twelve. Jesus was constantly calling on and engaging with others as he went about his teaching and ministry.




What might counter the polarisation of our day? Amongst our greatest resource is to seek out the emotion that accompanied the news

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

Latest news and topics discussed at the PC meeting held in October 2025. Full minutes can be found on the parish website via the following link: https://www.northcadbury.org.uk/meetings.php

<u>Welcome and Thank You</u> to Cllr Cameron Knee who was co-opted unanimously onto the PC.

Brookhampton Development: The Chairman read out an update from David Harragin, Planning Consultant at Origin 3, "No change our end. Still waiting on the council to provide full pre-app feedback. It has been escalated and supposedly we will receive a response shortly, nothing yet. Once we receive it, we can start work on the final planning application and Public Consultation event."

The Catash Inn as an Asset of Community Value (ACV):

Councillors agreed unanimously that the PC should apply to re-list the Catash Inn as an ACV as the listing expired as of 7 October 2025.

Report from The Newt and Emily Estate (EE): Zoe Young, Community Liaison Officer, reported as follows:

- Work progresses well on the Farm Build and at Yarlington Lodge.
- We're waiting for the planning approval for the Farmyard Hotel expansion to come through and in the meantime have been doing some low level enabling works at the site in preparation.
- There was an exceptional turnout for The George consultation in Castle Cary. We are currently collating all of the feedback to inform the next phase of planning. [Consultation plans available on the Parish Website under "News Updates"]

Wessex Water (WW): Matthew Kettle, WW Sewerage Data Technician, presented WW plans for remedial work to the sewerage system in North Cadbury and Galhampton. Councillors and residents outlined the issues in Mitchells Row, Brookhampton, which Matthew agreed to feedback and investigate. No works would be carried out until Spring 2026.

Rights of Way: The Chairman reported that a resident had raised issues with WN19/104 with EE. The hedge along the lane required cutting back in order that vehicles could safely access the route without hanging to drive partially on the track and partially in the drainage ditch. The EE Farm Team were due to address this.

There had been no update from Eve Wynn, SC Footpath Warden, with regards to the badger survey from Keir Construction on WN19/105 (Ridgeway Lane).

The Chairman asked for residents to continue to report any issues via the Explore Somerset website https://roam.somerset.gov.uk/roam/map.

<u>Light Pollution from North Cadbury Business Park:</u> The Clerk agreed to write to Taylors Coaches to ask if they could re-assess their security lighting, which was left on permanently and not operated by PIR.

<u>Hedges:</u> Cllr Rundle reported that despite the PC writing to the homeowner, the hedge encroaching the public highway on Cutty Lane had not been cut back. He would discuss this issue with Cllr H Hobhouse to ascertain whether this was on the SC enforcement list.

INTERVIEW - Good news of great joy

Revd Sarah Sanderson, Pioneer Associate Vicar at St James, Yeovil, shares some of the things planned for Christmas and Advent.



Celebrating together with our communities at Christmas

How will you be sharing the joy of Christmas with your community?

I've got both a church role and a pioneering one. In church, we'll have our carol and Christmas Eve services, plus a Christingle at the local garden centre which is joyful, and a lovely way to share the story of Jesus. We're running a 'camel hunt' through Advent. Families will find camels with words that build the Christmas message. It's fun, creative, and gets people talking about Jesus.

In my pioneering role on a new housing estate we'll go into school to make Christingles and share the story in assembly. Our toddler group will have a Christmas sing-along nativity, and our youth group will celebrate with a party too.

Why do you feel it is important to share the Christmas message in different places?

Some people feel daunted about coming into a church. It can feel less daunting to go to something that's clearly Christmassy, but not quite as formal as church. It's a great opportunity to open up the invitation. It is sharing with people that there's so much more to the Christian faith than just the Christmas season itself. We can invite people to understand they are welcome not only within church but to God himself.

How will you explore the Christmas story with young people?

A lot of young people haven't really heard the Christmas story in the way we might assume. So it's a great opportunity to share it afresh. With the toddlers, I do it through songs they already know, just changing the words slightly so they can learn the Christmas story that way.

The Christmas story and the Christian faith are becoming less well known. We've got a new generation who don't know the Bible stories, they don't know who Jesus is. That gives us an amazing opportunity - a clean slate - where we can come in and say, "Hey, there's this person, Jesus and this is who he is." Which is a really exciting place to start from.


