From the Vicar

Eight years ago, the Church of England embarked on the Living in Love and Faith (LLF) journey to try to come to an understanding of human sexuality and to find a way to be truly inclusive of same sex realtionships. Time has passed and there have been many painful conversations and experiences whihc have left many in the church disappointed, dismayed and hurting. You may have read about the recent decision by the House of Bishops to put the brakes on the process despite the clear feeling in General Synod and many in congregations that this is not the right thing to do. You may also have read about the threats by conservative churches to seek their own bishops, withold their money and to create their own church. This is deeply disturbing on many levels.

2026 looks to be a significant year for the Anglican Church with the enthronement of Archbishop Sarah followed by a meeting of General Synod in February where further debate of LLF will take place. Later in the year a futher conference will discuss the shape and future of the worldwide Anglican Communion. Much to pray about!

Two years ago, both our churches agreed that we would offer Prayers of Love and Faith to same sex couples seeking blessing of their relationship as we reflected on what the effect of this would be in our community. We used words like hospitality, welcome, acceptance, inclusivity and love.

As with so much of contemporary society, when the whole thing feels increasingly polarised, keeping quiet and getting on with things becomes the way we cope. Doing this might allow us to continue our day to day lives, but it also prevents us from facing and challenging the growing prejudices, and injustices that LGBTQ+ people face..

Confirmation

Bishop Michael is coming to Frome on Thursday 20th November to hold a service of confirmation at St. Johns. It's wonderful that Ruby (who sings in the choir at Christ Church) has decided that she wants to be baptised and confirmed. On Bible Sunday we presented her with a copy of the Youth Bible during the service and you are all invited to come along to St. Johns on Thursday 20 November at 7pm to accompany Ruby and others on this important and joyous occasion.



Christ Church PCC Decisions

At the last PCC meeting the work that Christ Church Future had been doing was presented as a series of recommendations about the next phase to the building works. The PCC is the decision making body and thanks to the clear and thoughtful presentation were able to make a number of decisions about the next steps.

The PCC have agreed to:

Replace the nave roof and replace the inadequate drainage piping to prevent water ingress in the church. As many of the old materials will be reused where possible.

To **create** an accessible entrance at the west end by creating a raised pathway. Again the intention is to use (and move the existing steps)

To **install** an external notice board to the wall immediately to the left of the West door

To **remove** the polycarbonate screens from the four lower windows on the north side as soon as possible and to begin to replace them in the Spring with new polycarbonate which will reveal the tracery and look much more welcoming

To **replace** and rewire the lighting in the servers' vestry before painting and decorating. This will give us a pleasant and warm room for meetings

We now need to begin to look seriously at raising funds and applying for grants to make this happen and we are working closely with our church architect as we seek the relevant permissions. It is a really exciting time and the support and vision of the PCC members has been hugely encouraging. If you have experience of fundraising the Christ Church Furutre team would love to hearf from you.

There is also the possibility of installing PV panels on the new roof and trialling under-pew heaters ...

Loop Frome

Many of you will have seen Ben cycling round town on his tricycle collecting food waste from local businesses and turning it into the most miraculous compost ever in the bins currently at Victoria Park. This community project grew out of Edventure and is a great way of creating a



sustainable and circular economy.. taking local waste and turning it into a local resource. Loop Frome are looking for a new home and St. Mary's PCC have agreed to offer hospitality to the project on a piece of the Paddock behind the prayer shed. We're looking forward to getting to know them and spreading some the compost in the Giant's Garden.


On Friday 12th December at midday, there is a gathering at St. Mary's which will begin with a dementia-friendly service and then lunch of soup and mince pies.
