

#### CHRISTMAS ISLAND x 2

HERE ARE TWO CHRISTMAS ISLANDS IN THE WORLD. The first is a dot in the Indian Ocean and even though it is in Australian territory, its closest neighbour is Java, 360km away. It's the summit of an oceanic mountain, rising to 36m above sea level and predominantly covered by tropical rainforest. Discovered in the early seventeenth century, Captain William Mynors named the island when he arrived on Christmas Day in 1643. The British Admiralty annexed the island on 6 June 1888, and phosphate extraction became the impetus behind the island's development. Today it's tourism and the population is fewer than 2,000 inhabitants, only one third of whom are female. Almost three quarters of the population are of Chinese origin, but all are Australian citizens and the Australian schooling system prevails. An interesting place indeed.

The other Christmas Island is one of the many islands in the Republic of Kiribati. Part of the Line Island Group, it is the largest coral atoll in the world. Its population is mainly Micronesian and, from the time of the Cold War, this Christmas Island will be remembered for the nuclear bomb tests that took place off its coast. This Christmas Island is at the forefront of the news today as those who served there during those tests are still fighting for compensation for the terrible consequences of the experiments for their health and the health of their offspring.


#### **Hathern Local History Society EXHIBITION**

#### ARE WE IN A "MAST YEAR"?

HAT IS A MAST YEAR?

Have you noticed a whole load of acorns under every oak tree this autumn? Are your bushes producing more berries than usual? Are there more conkers than you usually see? Are your apple trees overloaded? We could be in a mast year!

A mast year is when trees and shrubs produce a super abundance of fruits, nuts, and seeds, known as "mast." Instead of a scattering of acorns or the usual crop of berries, mast years bring thick carpets of nuts and seeds, heavy branches of fruit, and a feast for wildlife across our landscapes.



These events usually occur roughly every five years or so, although like all things in nature, this schedule is far from guaranteed! The recent dry year may have exacerbated the results this year! So why do trees produce bumper crops? One of the main theories for this behaviour is 'predator satiation'. Take oak as an example. Animals like squirrels, birds, mice and badgers feed on the acorns. When the trees produce smaller crops for a few consecutive years, they're effectively keeping the populations of these animals in check and also they don't get many of their acorns (their seeds) sown. But during a mast year, the trees produce more food than the animals can possibly eat.

This bounty causes a boom in populations of small mammals like mice. But much more importantly, it guarantees some acorns will be left over to survive and grow into new trees. Mast years have a major evolutionary advantage for the tree. Producing nuts is costly work and slightly stunts the tree's growth, but as it tends to happen every 5-10 years, it's worth the payoff for some of the crop to germinate into new saplings.

And this year, the trees may also be under stress as they haven't had the rainfall they need, and so this may have increased their seed production to counter a perceived threat. Our magnolia has produced berries for the first time since we were bought it, 30 years ago!


