

PRAYER DURING THE DAY

in

ADVENT

Taken from the Church of England's 'Prayer During the Day' this can be used at any time of day to provide a simple pattern for prayer and the reading of Scripture.

Psalms and readings: Use either the weekly cycle of short readings which are included here or a suitable daily lectionary.



PREPARATION

O God, make speed to save us.

O Lord, make haste to help us.

Your words have I hidden within my heart, that I should not sin against you. Psalm 119: 11



Sing a hymn, speak out your praise to God or use the following

Saviour eternal, life of the world unfailing, light everlasting and our true redemption.

Taking our humanity in your loving freedom, vou rescued our lost earth and filled the world with joy.

By your first advent justify us, by your second, set us free: that when the great light dawns and you come as judge of all, we may be robed in immortality and ready, Lord, to follow in your footsteps blest,

wherever they may lead.

Read the Psalm for the day.
Use either the cycle here or a suitable lectionary.

Sunday	Psalm 82	Thursday	Psalm 70
Monday	Psalm 13	Friday	Psalm 75
Tuesday	Psalm 14	Saturday	Psalm 85
Wednesday	Psalm 54	on any day	Psalm 80:1-8

At the end of the Psalm:

Glory to God, Source of All Being, Eternal Word and Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be forever. Amen.

Read one or more of the readings for the day. Use either the cycle here or a suitable lectionary.

REFLECTION AND RESPONSE

Reflect on the words of Scripture you have read. Ask the Holy Spirit to shape your understanding and life in response to the Scriptures.

The following response may be used

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness,

for they will be filled.

Matthew 5: 6



Pray for the Church, that she may be ready for the coming of Christ; for the leaders of the Church; for the nations, that they may be subject to the rule of God; for those who are working for justice in the world; for the broken, that they may find God's healing.

The following form of prayer may be used.

Watchful at all times, let us pray for strength to stand with confidence before our Maker and Redeemer.

That God may bring in the kingdom with justice and mercy, let us pray to the Lord:

That God may establish among the nations a sceptre of righteousness, let us pray to the Lord:

That we may seek Christ in the scriptures and recognize him in the breaking of the bread, let us pray to the Lord:

That God may bind up the broken-hearted, restore the sick and raise up all who have fallen, let us pray to the Lord:

That the light of God's coming may dawn on all who live in darkness and the shadow of death, let us pray to the Lord:

That with all the saints in light, we may shine forth as lights of the world, let us pray to the Lord:

Let us commend the world, which Christ will judge, to the mercy and protection of God.

Open prayer may be offered.

Silence is kept



Pray the Collect of the day or the following

Keep us, O Lord,
while we tarry on this earth,
in a serious seeking after you,
and in an affectionate walking with you,
every day of our lives;
that when you come,
we may be found not hiding our talent,
nor serving the flesh,
nor yet asleep with our lamp unfurnished,
but waiting and longing for our Lord,
our glorious God for ever. **Amen.**
