Organ Voluntary

Frank Bridge, pupil of Stanford and tutor of Britten, is still quite overlooked as an English composer of stature in the early 20th Century style. He wrote three pieces specifically for the organ, well-crafted and suited to the instrument's nature; here is the first, simply called *Allegro Moderato*. This set was first published in 1905. "Offstage" type trumpet calls

alternate with full organ, but the prevailing mood is of woven melodies and thoughtful build-ups. At the end there appears a blazing C major resolution approached by darker chords; those shadows don't quite fade.

WORKSOP REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY PARADE – 9 NOVEMBER 2025
