We receive no money from Chester Diocese and depend on the generosity of our parishioners for regular support.

Where does the money go?

This year, 2025, it costs us almost £4,000 **a week** to pay the bills, maintain the buildings and offer ministry to all in the parish.

We care for three listed buildings and the surrounding land. Both churches and Caldy Hall require ongoing maintenance.

If you're already a visitor at our churches, or simply value that they are still here, please ask yourself if it would matter

- If our work with children and families stopped
- If the tower clock stopped
- If the churchyards and memorials were not cared for and the paths became unsafe
- If the organ was no longer usable and we couldn't hold concerts in church
- If our buildings fell into disrepair and had to be closed
