Today's hymns are...

366 O God our help in ages past

This very special hymn was one of the many written by Isaac Watts and the tune was composed by William Croft. It will also be sung at the Cenotaph in London this morning at the nation's Remembrance observance.

114 Eternal Father, strong to save

The poet William Whiting wrote this stirring hymn which is well used by both the Royal and United States navies. The tune is by John Bacchus Dykes.

60 Bind us together, Lord

Bob Gillman, who wrote this hymn, born in West Ham in 1946, was encouraged by his parents to attend a Baptist church and he became Christian the age of 13.

Sheet I vow to Thee my country

Sir Cecil Arthur Spring Rice, who wrote this hymn, served as British Ambassador to the United States from 1912 to 1918 and was responsible for organising British efforts to end American neutrality during the First World War. He was a close friend of President Theodore Roosevelt and was best man at his second wedding. The tune is by Gustav Holst.

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies.

Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written,

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
