



Reverend Clifford's Weekly Blog 'Do not forget; It only took one small spark'



8th November 2025

Remember, remember the 5th of November, gunpowder, treason and plot.

In the life of the church November is the month of remembrance, it allows us to gather as church and community in various ways. Last week we opened the doors of the church to all who have lost loved ones at any time in their lives, to light a candle, say some prayers or simply just pause from our own busy lives and look back. Many names were read out of people who have touched our lives in some way. It was a moving service and this Sunday both church and community will gather again up and down this land of ours and read more names of those who gave their lives in defence of us. Too many lives laid down often so young, engraved in memorial walls and crosses, lists of whole families, brothers, sisters, uncles and aunts, fathers, mothers, sons and daughters, whole communities that sacrificed so much. We will remember them, but is that enough; because we need to act upon their sacrifice, we need to seek the common good and work together for peace so that we never have to add more names to those memorials which sadly we continue to do year on year, an endless list of human misery, when will we write the final word, The End?

We will also be remembering together as a community tonight as this is sent out this Saturday morning, gathered around the bonfire at the bottom of Pond hill, remembering Guy Fawkes. Following a national tradition dating back to the 17th Century when treason, plot and gunpowder are remembered, fireworks will brighten up the darkness and send every neighbourhood dog wild; but for a short time, our fear of explosions will subside as maybe we remember those who still wake up or live in fear of real missile attacks everyday of their lives.

November is for remembering but the real treason comes when we walk away and simply return to the old things, the old ways, when the mildest of confrontation flows from our being again. Like a firework or the bonfires that smoulder having consumed everything placed in their flames, **it only took one small spark** to engulf, ignite and destroy the fuel which it rendered back to ash. Each war and human conflict started

with just one wrong word or action, it forgot forgiveness, it forgot the consequences, it forgot its own humanity.

Remember this November the words of the psalmist, (psalm 139: 14) 'I am fearfully and wonderfully made.' That means you and that means me and note that the word fear in this original context means, I'm in awe, left in wonder and have great reverence for what is. You are awesome, so am I! I'm not being flippant here, its true we are all amazing creations, there is no one like us outside of the world we know, you and I are precious and if we need to remember anything at all this November; or any other month or day of the year, we need to remember this, because when we do we will begin to value life in its fullness.

November reminds us that to often we have failed to be fearful, to be awe struck, to step back and truly appreciate the gift of life, of all life on earth. I have heard to often as a parish priest the confrontation of petty squabbles that divide families and communities alike, energy spent on destruction rather than construction. Yes sometimes we can't resolve everything but that is why we were given the gift of movement, for times when we simply walk away, like taking a kettle of the heat, it will stop boiling, like blowing out the spark that will cause a fire or an explosion, **it simply takes one small action to cancel a chain reaction.**

Let us then remember this November and in honour of those who we remember, let us learn to truly live in unity with each other so that as Jesus once said, we might start living life to the full.


