BIBLE READINGS for Sunday 7 December 2025

New Testament - Romans 15 verses 4 to 13:

For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. ⁵ May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶ so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

⁷ Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. ⁸ For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, ⁹ and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

- 'Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles, and sing praises to your name';
- ¹⁰ and again he says, 'Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people';
- ¹¹ and again, 'Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples praise him';
- ¹² and again Isaiah says, 'The root of Jesse shall come, the one who rises to rule the Gentiles; in him the Gentiles shall hope.'
- ¹³ May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel - Matthew 3 verses 1 to 12:

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ² 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' ³ This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

- 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:
- "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.""
- ⁴ Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵ Then the people of Jerusalem and all Judea were going out to him, and all the region along the Jordan, ⁶ and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷ But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸ Bear fruit worthy of repentance. ⁹ Do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰ Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ 'I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing-fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

Psalm 80:

Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock! You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth

² before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh.

Stir up your might, and come to save us!

³ Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

- ⁴O Lord God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?
- ⁵ You have fed them with the bread of tears, and given them tears to drink in full measure.
- ⁶ You make us the scorn of our neighbours; our enemies laugh among themselves.
- ⁷ Restore us, O God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved.
- ⁸ You brought a vine out of Egypt; you drove out the nations and planted it.
- ⁹ You cleared the ground for it; it took deep root and filled the land.
- ¹⁰ The mountains were covered with its shade, the mighty cedars with its branches;
- ¹¹ it sent out its branches to the sea, and its shoots to the River.
- ¹² Why then have you broken down its walls, so that all who pass along the way pluck its fruit?
- ¹³ The boar from the forest ravages it, and all that move in the field feed on it.
- ¹⁴ Turn again, O God of hosts; look down from heaven, and see; have regard for this vine,
- the stock that your right hand planted.
- ¹⁶ They have burned it with fire, they have cut it down; may they perish at the rebuke of your countenance.
- ¹⁷ But let your hand be upon the one at your right hand, the one whom you made strong for yourself.
- ¹⁸ Then we will never turn back from you; give us life, and we will call on your name.
- ¹⁹ Restore us, O Lord God of hosts; let your face shine, that we may be saved.
