





## Thought for the Month

**Happy New Year to all!** I wonder how you celebrated New Year? Did you stay up late to see the New Year in? Did you go to a party? Or did you just go to bed, hoping you wouldn't be disturbed by any fireworks? When I was a child, one of our neighbours used to bang dustbin lids together and shout 'Happy New Year' – not something that would really work with today's plastic bins, let alone wheelie bins!



New Year is marked around the world in very different ways and even on different dates. Whilst we celebrate New Year on 1<sup>st</sup> January, the Chinese New Year is set by the lunisolar calendar, beginning on the first new moon between 21<sup>st</sup> January and 20<sup>th</sup> February. This year it will be on 17<sup>th</sup> February and will mark the beginning of the Year of the Fire Horse. Chinese people consider New Year (Spring Festival/ Ch'ñ Jik) important because it symbolizes renewal, family unity, and the arrival of good fortune. It is the most significant holiday in Chinese culture, rooted in ancient myths, agricultural cycles, and traditions that emphasize harmony, prosperity, and hope.

However, the Jewish New Year (Rosh Hashanah) in 2026 will not begin until sundown on 11<sup>th</sup> September. It will mark the start of the Hebrew year 5787. Jews consider New Year important because it is both the birthday of the world (some orthodox Jews believe that the year reflects the date God created the earth) and a day of judgment and renewal, shaping the spiritual direction of the year ahead.

Here in the UK, we tend to see New Year as a time to make a fresh start and to make new year's resolutions. A survey showed that in 2025 the most popular resolutions were as follows:

1. **Exercise more** planned to increase their physical activity.
2. **Eat more healthily**: 36% aimed to improve their diet.
3. **Lose weight**: 32% hoped to shed some pounds.
4. **Get more sleep**: 29% planned to improve their sleep quality.
5. **Drink more water**: 34% hoped to increase their water intake.
6. **Travel more**: 32% planned to explore new places.
7. **Cut down phone use**: 16% aimed to reduce their screen time.
8. **Read more books**: 15% wanted to spend more time reading.
9. **Try meditation**: 14% planned to practice mindfulness.
10. **Improve their living space**: 13% planned to organise their living space and improve their home environment.

But whether or not we make formal New Year resolutions, we all tend to see a new year as an opportunity for a fresh start, a chance to look back at the year just gone and to think about how we want to live in the twelve months to come. It is an opportunity for us to take stock and to rethink our priorities, and this applies to our spiritual lives too. Are there things that I need to do more of, or perhaps even less of? Is God calling me to do something new for him this year? The following prayer by Francis Brienens invites us to step out into this new year with God:

**God of all time, who makes all things new,  
we bring before you the year now ending.  
For life full and good, for opportunities recognized and taken,  
for love known and shared,  
we thank you.**

**Where we have fallen short,  
Forgive us.  
When we worry over what is past,  
Free us.**

**As we begin again  
and take our first few steps into the future,  
where nothing is safe and certain, except you,  
we ask for the courage of the wise men  
who simply went and followed a star.  
We ask for their wisdom,  
in choosing to pursue the deepest truth,  
not knowing where they would be led.  
In the year to come, God of all time,  
be our help and company.  
Hold our hands as we journey onwards  
and may your dream of shalom,  
where all will be at peace,  
be our guiding star.  
Amen.**

### The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity - One Body, One Spirit

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is traditionally observed from the **18th to the 25th January** – in the octave of St. Peter and St. Paul.

For 2026, the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, along with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches.

These resources draw upon centuries-old traditions of prayer and petitions used by the Armenian people, along with hymns that originated in the ancient monasteries and churches of Armenia, some of which date as far back as the fourth century. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026 extends an invitation to draw upon this shared Christian heritage and to delve more deeply into our fellowship in Christ, which unites Christians worldwide.

The epistles of St Paul stress the importance of unity within the Church, urging us to live lives worthy of our calling with humility, gentleness, patience and love (Ephesians 4:1-3). Ephesians 4:4 summarises the teachings of Paul about unity, emphasising that the followers of Christ represent ‘one body and one Spirit’, united in a single hope. This metaphor signifies the Church as a unified entity transcending barriers of geography, nationality, ethnicity and tradition. Paul uses the metaphor of the Church being the Body of Christ to describe its unity within the diversity of its members.

Introducing the material prepared for this year’s Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, His Grace Bishop Hovakim Manukyan, who is Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of the United Kingdom and Ireland, together with Dr Nicola Brady General Secretary Churches Together in Britain and Ireland write:

*With the Armenian diaspora numbering many times the population of the country itself, the Armenian Church brings together a truly global community that is present in Russia and in Ukraine, and throughout the Middle East. The Armenian community is impacted by these conflicts that have captured the attention of the world, while also experiencing the pain of the comparative neglect of the situation of the Armenian people attacked and displaced by Azerbaijan. The ethnic cleansing and associated human rights abuses perpetrated against the Armenian people, especially in the ancient Armenian homeland of Artsakh, have been well documented by international human rights observers, yet the international community fails to act as lives are lost, families are displaced, people are unjustly imprisoned and cultural heritage is destroyed.*

*For Churches Together in Britain and Ireland (CTBI) and the National Ecumenical Instruments on these islands, the Diocese of the Armenian Church of the United Kingdom and Ireland has provided a powerful witness to the call to be peacemakers – through prayer, through advocacy and humanitarian aid, through peace education, and through hospitality and encounter. This goes hand in hand with a deeply rooted commitment to Christian unity as integral to how we live out Christ’s commandment to love our neighbour, and as a source of hope in troubled times.*

*This Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, let us unite in prayer and advocacy for the people of Armenia and Artsakh, calling for an end to violence and the restoration of peace. Together, we can shine a light on these injustices and, in doing so, help build a future where the rights of all are upheld and respected.*



If you were fortunate, you may have been given a book token for Christmas.

Perhaps you knew straight away which book you would like to buy. Perhaps you already have a list of books you are planning to read, or perhaps you are still trying to decide . . .

So, if you are looking for some fresh inspiration, Hannah Dunnett has produced a book full of paintings which are both beautiful to look at and inspiring to read and reflect upon.

Hannah has created a book that combines inspiring words from The Bible within her beautiful illustrations. When she was working to produce two large paintings for a special exhibition, Hannah began to think about "How to use an image to draw someone's attention and to engage them in thinking about faith and God." She decided "to paint scripture passages into the texture of the painting to give a deeper meaning and to illustrate and bring imagery to the words." In this book, Hannah tells the story behind each of the twenty-four of her favourite pictures.



Hannah originally studied medicine and worked as a family doctor but she never lost her childhood love of creativity. Eventually, following all the enthusiasm shown by people for her work, she decided to become an artist to use her talents to help others to visualise the symbolism of the inspirational words in the Bible.

The journalist Kate Nicholas has described Hannah's work as "inscribing God's word onto landscapes, seascapes and everyday environments with her poetic brush strokes, she is creating deeply meditative images that help us to internalise His truths."

## St Blasius Branch of the Mothers' Union An exciting Programme for 2026




