Rachel writes . . .

As I write this we are in the final week before Christmas, so it feels a little odd to be writing something people will read in January. There is still all the rush and celebration of Christmas to come, then the lull between Christmas and New Year; finally the first days of 2026 will have come around. Some of us will have made resolutions; others will not.

The best resolution I ever made was to read a book a week. It required quite a commitment to read every day - even when I felt like watching television or scrolling through my phone, but I really enjoyed it once I got over the hump of pushing myself to get back into the habit of reading. It also meant carrying books around - on the train in Tokyo, sitting waiting to meet friends, at work at lunchtime - but becoming aware of all the available space in my days and consciously filling at least some of that space with reading was well worth the effort. It also helped me to have plenty of suggestions for the members of my Japanese Ladies' reading group when it was time to choose a new book for us to read.

Thinking about my Year of Determined and Intentional Reading, I was reminded of a Japanese term, *tsundoku* (積ん読), which describes the habit of buying lots of books and letting them pile up without reading them. I realised when I moved house last summer just how many books I have! So I have decided in 2026 to have another Year of Determined and Intentional Reading, by reading some of the giant pile of books I have accumulated and not read yet. When I googled *tsundoku*, the AI summary at the top of the search results mentioned that *while once negative, tsundoku is often seen positively as a sign of intellectual curiosity or a reminder of what you still have to learn*. Contemplating the number of books I have accumulated, I am either an extremely intellectually curious person, or my subconscious is telling me that I still have a great amount to learn!

If you are the type of person who likes to make a New Year's resolution, I hope it will be something that you enjoy, or feel better for doing - something that opens up a new space in your life, or gives you a new view or experience. And if you are not that type of person, but someone who prefers to step into the new year without that pressure or added expectation on yourself, I hope that too will bring you joy.

I know that I have quoted this poem by Minnie Louise Haskins, but it always comes to mind at this time of year:

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year:

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown".

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way".

As we step into 2026, I wish you all a year full of love, joy, hope and peace.

NON-ALCOHOLIC MULLED WINE

Prep 10 mins Cook 10 mins Serves 6

Ingredients:

500ml pomegranate juice
25g golden caster sugar
Handful of frozen blackberries
250ml apple juice
1 cinnamon stick
1 star anise
4 cloves
3 black peppercorns
1 orange, quartered

Method:

Put the pomegranate juice, sugar, blackberries and apple juice in a saucepan. Add the cinnamon, star anise, cloves, peppercorns, and orange. Heat gently until simmering. Taste for sweetness, then strain into heatproof glasses.



THE BURNING CHAMBERS

This historical novel is set in Carcassonne in the Languedoc region in France in 1562. Nineteen year old Minou Joubert receives an anonymous letter in her father's bookshop. Sealed with a distinctive family crest, it contains just five words:

She knows that you live.

We are already intrigued, but before Minou can decipher the mysterious message, a chance encounter with a young Huguenot convert, Piet Reydon, changes her destiny forever. Piet has a dangerous mission of his own, and he will need Minou's help if he is to get out of La Cite alive.

This is an epic story with many threads. It has a romance between star-crossed lovers - a Huguenot and a Catholic. The religious wars are the backdrop where the Huguenots are being persecuted by the Catholics. There are many characters in the novel, excellently drawn, Vidal and Blanche are two people who will do anything to achieve their ambitions.

There are lots of secrets and twists and turns, but overall a very satisfying and pacy read. There are no cliffhangers and all the plot lines are resolved.

Deep snow, no school homework, no buses and banks of snow on the road. Local boys having snowball fights.

Now with my new sledge and my friend we could go to Keys field, a field full of rabbits and deep holes and small mounds, a former mining site. We joined the local boys at the top of the field. We had to steer the sledge down the slope in order to stop under a gate which led to a side railway track. We then pulled the sledge up the hill again. My fingers and feet were numb. Oh, I had forgotten it was choir practice for the Christmas services and carol singing and had to dash home.



CHICKEN PASTA BAKE

Prep 30 mins Cook 45 mins Serves 6

Ingredients:

4 tbsp Olive oil
1 Onion, finely chopped
2 Garlic cloves, crushed
1/4 tsp Chilli flakes
2 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes
1tsp Caster sugar
6 tbsp Mascarpone
4 Skinless chicken breasts, sliced
300g Penne pasta
70g Mature Cheddar grated
50g Mozzarella grated
Small bunch parsley, finely chopped

Method:

1. Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a pan over a medium heat and fry the onion gently for 10-12 mins. Add the garlic and chilli flakes and cook for 1 min. Tip in the tomatoes and sugar and season to taste. Simmer uncovered for 20 mins or until thickened, then stir through the mascarpone.
2. Heat 1 tbsp of oil in a non-stick frying pan. Season the chicken and fry for 5-7 mins or until the chicken is cooked through.
3. Heat the oven to 220C/200c fan/gas7. Cook the penne following pack instructions. Drain and toss with the remaining oil. Tip the pasta into a medium sized ovenproof dish. Stir in the chicken and pour over the sauce. Top with the cheddar, mozzarella, and parsley. Bake for 20 mins or until golden brown and bubbling.






