# Benefice December 2025 Groby and Ratby



Dear Friends,

It seems people really like to celebrate! Many "Christmas" parties, concerts and bazaars will start soon (and may have already started). It's tempting to feel worn out even before Advent begins. When Christmas does arrive, we will all be ready for sleep!

Yet, among all these things, our experience of Christmas will be as varied as we all are, with different reasons to celebrate and different ways of celebrating.

Many will be expecting a big gathering and lots of cheer (of the 80° variety, maybe) and some enjoying a quiet time! On the other hand, there may be others who have reasons for not welcoming what our culture has decided is the biggest party of the year commercially and a time.



when everyone is supposed to be happy.

We all, I suspect, know of people who are not looking forward to it. Some will have recently been bereaved and lost a loved one. Then again, I was speaking to a chap the other day who has a drink problem and knows that Christmas, where the family always over-indulges, will bring his brave attempts to become dry to nought. Another said he only remembers childhood family rows and expects that this Christmas will be no different. Then I met a woman who remembered Christmases past where, as a girl, there would be a huge gathering and much merriment. Yet, now, in later years she is facing the prospect of Christmas alone, when she will see no-one.

It's then I wonder whether the expectations that or culture places on this time of year, will obfuscate what the Christian celebration should really be all about.

Now, tradition is a wonderful gift. I would not make light of it. Christmas customs of celebration can be valuable and can create good memories that last forever. However, tradition and custom can also make us feel cut off and it may be there we can feel pain, not anticipation. It all depends on what our "good news" is.

For it's not the coming of our Lord which causes pain, for, should we open our eyes to it, the message of Christmas is good news of great joy for all who will open their ears to hear. If the celebration this year is causing anxiety, as the past squeezes us too forcefully into an unwanted mold, perhaps it's time to consider again the real "reason for the season."

Jesus came to bring the assurance that He is Emmanuel, "God with us." God knows our feelings, not because he has a good imagination (although I'm sure he has), but because he has been here and has 'shared our human condition.' He knew grief and loneliness, pain and victimisation. The Incarnation reminds us that when we cry, God cries, too.

We can sense God's grief at the way the world is. His grief at the way His Son was treated when he came on earth to proclaim God's Kingdom. Yet, through pure love the Son of God, the King who was born in humble circumstances laid down his life for us. If we open our hearts we can sense his love for us, especially when we are "poor in spirit". In fact, when we are at our lowest then maybe our eyes can be opened to the reality of his wonderful gift of life.

The true peace of Christmas is there to be sought in the here and now and not re-manufactured from the past, not to be found in the tinselled trappings of the commercial Christmas. Recognizing grace in the present moment is the key to a real celebration that God really is with us. Then this Christmas will not be the same as other years. The true celebration of Christmas should help us walk into the future, bearing hope in a world seemingly gone mad.

So, we have an opportunity to celebrate Christmas differently this year, discovering again what many of us already know but need to be reminded about. That it's not about stuff. It's not about the past. It's not about a vague "Christmassy feeling" but about the "presence," that sense that the Kingdom of God is close and that we can reach out and grasp it.

At Christmas our Churches in Groby and Ratby will gather to stand as witness to the miracle of the Incarnation, proclaiming again that God is with us. All are invited to join in. Whatever your situation, whoever you are, our doors will be open to all who seek to investigate this truth for themselves.

So, look out for our Christmas cards, as always, showing when and where our services will take place. In particular, there will be in Groby and Ratby parish churches' Open Church afternoons\*, for people who have lost loved ones, or have other things on their hearts, to spend a time of quiet and remembrance, to light a candle and maybe write a prayer.

This year we have the opportunity to make Christmas real again, by understanding the "reason for the season", that Christ came down at Christmas bringing true hope to a world in pain, creating a light which will never Go out....


The date was the 4<sup>th</sup> October and we had a weekend booked at Blackwell Adventure Camp. It was planned by the Midlands URC synod and was


generously subsidised by them. As myself and 6 youngsters from our Rock Solid group set off for



Even the marshmallows were vegan round our campfire and yes this year it lit!



# Rector's Ramblings

A few years ago, I remember hearing of complaints from some training incumbents (TIs) that they had curates refusing to do certain 'menial' tasks. On being asked to help with simple things they were apparently retorting to their hapless TIs that they hadn't done all this training at theological college 'just to move chairs'. This made me laugh as when I was at Queen's my liturgy tutor, Mark Earey, did indeed train me (and us all!) to do just that. As an engineer prior to ordination he was very particular about the alignment of the chairs in the Chapel, so if we ever moved the chairs for a new arrangement when we were leading worship, they were to be returned to EXACTLY their original position with proper engineering precision. And I remember looking carefully along the line of chairs to ensure they were perfectly aligned, as we all knew Mark would comment if one was so much as a millimetre out of place!

But more than teaching me how to put chairs in place, I learned humility and to do the tasks that might quietly need to be done whether others notice or not. I have been thinking about all the work that goes on 'behind the scenes', as those that have looked at the recent CTG/EXTEND newsletter will have noticed. And our churches are full of those who work behind the scenes in a myriad of ways too numerous to list. But the work of the PCC keeping bills paid, the church building intact and all the other practical and statutory tasks is not to be forgotten. Services and sermons take time to prepare and that's not just me, but those who also help lead and preach and help organise sidespeople, readers, intercessors, refreshments folk and so on. And don't forget the work of the flower arrangers, bell ringers, purificator cleaners/ironers, children's volunteers, Tasters, Fair Cuppa, coffee morning and lunch and cinema club organisers and helpers - and all those who move chairs around and help put up screens to enable so many of these things to happen. Musicians practice, organisers of events spend hours in preparation and many folk make or bake things for the host of things we do. And each of us only sees the outcome of most of this in the things we do in church. But everything is underpinned by the guiet, often unseen and dedicated work, of so many in church. And these pieces of work, as we look towards Christmas, are some of the best gifts you all give - for you give of yourselves, just as Jesus did in becoming one of us.

And I thank Mark Earey for teaching me of the humility I need to reflect the love and humility of Jesus. I move a lot of chairs and, strangely, I do it with joy!

## Riffat's Recipes

# Gajar ka Halwa (Pakistani Style) Carrot pudding

Ingredients: 1 kg red carrots (desi gajar) peeled and finely grated,

- 1 litre full-fat milk
- 4-5 green cardamoms slightly crushed
- ½ cup ghee (clarified butter)
- ½ to ¾ cup sugar adjust to your taste
- 1/4 cup khoya / mawa (optional but gives rich flavour)
- 2-3 tbsp condensed milk (optional, for extra richness)
- ½ cup mixed nuts sliced almonds, pistachios, cashews Raisins (optional)

#### Instructions:

Prepare the Carrots:

Wash, peel, and grate the carrots using a hand grater or food processor. *Cook the Carrots in Milk*:

In a large, heavy-bottomed pan or pot, add the grated carrots and the milk.,Add the crushed green cardamoms.

Cook on medium heat until the milk starts to boil. Then lower the heat and let the carrots cook slowly in the milk. Stir occasionally to prevent burning.

Continue cooking until all the milk is absorbed. This can take around 30–45 minutes.

#### Add Ghee:

Once the milk is absorbed and the carrots are soft, add  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup ghee. Sauté the mixture in ghee for 10–15 minutes on medium heat until it turns a deeper colour and becomes aromatic.

# Add Sugar and Khoya:

Add sugar and mix. The halwa will become slightly watery again as sugar melts.

Continue cooking until the moisture evaporates and it thickens again. Add khoya (or condensed milk if using), and cook for another 5–10 minutes.
