Poetry and practical advice.

There's poetry and practical advice across our readings today. The prophet and author we call Isaiah is actually a collection of writers putting things down on papyrus over at least two centuries. What they share is poetry, and there's a lot of theology which is poetry. One of the ways we can read this is to replace the issues front and centre of their minds with our equivalents today.

Fresh water was a major preoccupation for them. We take fresh water for granted. We just turn on a tap. What are the worries we have which give us stress and get in the way of wholesome relationships with one another; and get in the way of our relationship with God?

The water issue was also present in John the Baptist's day. Maybe even mores pressing was the 'existential' threat of the Roman occupation of what we call the Holy Land. Occupation, and other factors pressing down on us, cause frustration which we may take out on other people, as we project that and our frustration with ourselves onto others. Who are we? I think James alludes to that today.

The solution? Hard though it is when the going is tough, but is not Jesus saying in John 11 that being His disciple is the only identity for us which really matters? Fr A.

Welcome to the Eucharist, also known as Holy Communion or The Mass

This act of worship is a partnership between the priest and the people who:

- greet each other in the Lord's name
- confess their sins and, if repentant, are assured of God's forgiveness
- keep silence and pray a Collect
 (a special prayer or collection of
 thoughts for that day)
- proclaim and respond to the word of God in scripture and reflect on it
- pray for the Church, the world and those in need
- exchange the Peace (this should be a simple gesture, not a major interruption to the flow of the service)
- prepare the table (it is only a table, but it becomes an altar)
- pray the Eucharistic Prayer (listen along and pray, and over time these words will become more familiar to you.
- break the bread (which recalls Christ's body, broken on the Cross)
- receive communion (or a blessing instead)
- depart with God's blessing, to go in peace to love and serve the Lord

If you have arrived very late, relax! Sit still and make your confession knowing God understands and loves you. Then read the Gospel, and join us in full when you are ready.
