Stephen

Good King Wenceslas looked out on the Feast of Stephen 1853,

John Mason Neale 1818-1866

This carol, which is set to a 13th Century melody, is based on a legend about Wenceslaus I, otherwise Václav the Good, who was a Prince of Bohemia. In 935 AD he was assassinated by his younger brother, Boleslaus the Cruel. His popularity and martyrdom led to Wenceslas being posthumously canonised and declared King and Patron Saint of the Czech state. The carol relates his journey to bring relief to a peasant. This is said to be on the Feast of Stephen which is one of the Feast days which are very rarely mentioned in our current pattern of Worship. It occurs on 26th December, the day after Christmas Day which we would recognise as Boxing Day from the custom of donating gifts to those in need.

But what of Saint Stephen. The early church was growing to such an extent that disagreements broke out about apparent unfair daily distribution of food. The twelve Apostles decided to recruit seven men to take over this role so that they could concentrate on the Ministry of the Word [Acts 6: 1-4]. Stephen who is described as "a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit" was amongst the chose seven. [Acts 4: 5]

Stephen went on to perform great wonders and signs among the people, to such an extent that he came into conflict with the Jewish authorities. Stephen defended himself and his activities against the ruling Sanhedrin with an exposition of the divinity of Jesus [Acts 7: 1-53] This was to no avail as the dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death [Acts 7: 54-60] Thus he became the first recorded Chrystian Martyr. A young man named Saul was present with the task of guarding the coats. He was to go on to persecute the growing Church but following an encounter with the Risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was set to spread the Gospel throughout a large part of the Roman Empire and through writing letters to the churches he established, formed most of our New Testament.

Most of the prophesies in the Old Testament refer to a future leader who would be descended from King David and would restore Israel, bringing peace, and establishing justice. In many ways they remind us that the birth of Jesus in humble surroundings marks the fulfilment

of these prophesies.

The Coming of the Kingdom is a present reality and a future hope. This week we will be celebrating the arrival of Jesus into the history of our world We should take some time out to prepare for and actively anticipate the appointed time that, as we say week by week in our Creed, Jesus will return to judge the living and the dead. This will be the complete victory over evil and the completion of God's redemptive plan.

The elements of the Nativity will be familiar to us. A country under subjection to the Roman Empire. The call for an Empire-wide census which meant a hazardous seventy-mile journey for a young, pregnant girl. The lack of suitable lodgings and a birth in a modest stable. Angels appearing over the surrounding fields telling a group of shepherds that a Saviour had been born to them who is the Messiah, the Lord. Their hasty visit to the stable and, returning to their daily routine, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed [Luke 2: 17-18] We should follow their example.
