

PASTORAL LETTER

Greetings dear reader.

One of the difficulties I have in terms of celebrating Christmas is that the nativity story is so familiar. Thus, each year, I try to do something different that allows me to see the Nativity in a new light. This year I was inspired by a book entitled 'Gathering around the manger'. It consists of forty little commentaries, one for each day in Advent. Each page concentrates on one character who was part of the Nativity. You might ask how did the book got to forty characters since in the gospels we are only told about the main characters, like the shepherds, the wise men and the escape to Egypt. Well, if you include characters like the innkeeper, his wife and the other guests then you can get to forty quite easily. Indeed, there are children's books where words are put into the mouths of the ox and the ass.

Thus, this year I have been inspired by the innkeeper's story or rather what I imagined his story to be. There is nothing said about him in the gospels. All we are told in is that *Mary gave birth and wrapped the baby in cloths because there was no room for them in the inn* (Luke 2:7). Thus, I assume the inn had an innkeeper and he was a man. I guess this man had a wife and children. I guess he was the one who said to Joseph, I'm sorry but there's no room in this inn but you can stay in the stable. I guess his wife helped Mary look after the baby – was she the one who supplied the swaddling cloths? However, the big question for me is what happened to the innkeeper thereafter?

However, the big question for me is what happened to the innkeeper thereafter? How was he affected? Was he like the shepherds who were in awe as they saw the babe, or was it just 'another day at the office'? I like to think it was the former – that he followed Jesus and that seeing the birth changed him and his family forever.

I like the title of the book, 'Gathering around the manger', surely the innkeeper was one of those who gathered round and marvelled at this gift from God. It occurs to me that we too are part of the story for we are gather round the manger as we celebrate Christmas. We gather alongside the shepherds and wise men as well as the innkeeper as we gaze on the nativity. Why not take a moment now to ponder and effectively gather round the manger alongside the shepherds, the wise men and that innkeeper?

Prayer: Thank you Lord that you came to us as a babe and that we too can gather round and share in the excitement of your birth this Christmas season. Amen.



World Day of Prayer 2026 Nigeria "I will give you rest, come.."

Our service on Friday 6th March 2026 has been prepared by our sisters in Nigeria reflecting on the theme "I will give you rest".

Planning was initiated in 2017 when World Day of Prayer Nigeria was selected to be the writing committee for 2026; time for research, reflection, and prayer, shaping the final draft before presenting the service we will be using.

The arrival of the service booklets and all the resources in the summer/ early autumn is always exciting. But even before that some of us will have attended a small conference in London to find out more about the country involved. We meet the National committee and others from all around the UK who, like us, will be holding Preparation Days so that any World Day of Prayer committee can plan to hold the service within their own communities.

In October, working together with the Thame committee, we hosted a Preparation Day at St Joseph's in Thame with almost 30 delegates, many from villages and market towns in Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire. We presented a slide show about Nigeria, its background, culture, and history, reviewed resources, practised the hymns and particularly the Nigerian song of welcome, discussed issues raised in the service and celebrated the service itself. Best of all we enjoyed the company of two Nigerian colleagues who brought personal memories of growing up and living in their homeland to our discussions.

Now, our Chinnor committee is starting to prepare for the service which will be held at St Andrew's church on Friday 6th March at 10.30am and again at 7.30pm. We offer our resources to schools and to church children's and youth groups. All three of our village churches have at least two members on the committee, if you run a children's or youth group and are interested in finding out more do ask to be put in touch through any of the church administrators/contacts.



PARTNERS ACTION

At a recent conservation event, Regina spotted what looked like tiny pink fungi growing on a dead log. It was a species neither she nor I had seen before.

Using our identification apps, we discovered that it wasn't a fungus at all but a single cell amoeba called Wolfs milk. In its fruiting state, it resembles a small fundus



and is almost iridescent pink. However, within one day, it turns chestnut brown. A few days later, it will be on the move as a red jelly, in search of

new food.

In its jelly form, it can search out and find new food by creating tubes through which it travels. It cuts off old tubes behind it, which, as they dry, create a trail, so that in future the amoeba knows where to go for a reliable food source.

Isn't it incredible that God has created such extraordinary intelligence in a singular cell organism? When it works together as a jelly made up of thousands of individual amoebae, they have the intellect to know how to hunt as well as remember where food is!

We live in an incredible world in which the intelligence of nature is often profoundly underrated, and it points the way to the author of intelligent design.

During this autumn season, it is worth getting out and spending time looking at the details. It is often in the intricacies of life and its complexity that we can truly see God at work.

Eulogy for John Rutson

Former Church warden and verger of St Andrew's

The kindest and gentlest of men.



John Charles Rutson was born in Hornsey on 29th April 1935 to his very proud parents Edith and Charles. He lived in Crouch End, North London, with his parents and younger sister Pat. After their home was bombed in the war they were evacuated to Sandy, Bedfordshire before settling in North Mymms.

John went to St Albans County Grammar school for boys, where he passed A levels in Maths, Physics and Chemistry in 1953.

John started work in London as an actuary in the North British and Mercantile insurance company in Fenchurch Street, where he met Janet, when he dictated letters for her to type. After work, with friends, they would often go to the



London West End cinemas. Their first date was to see Lady and the Tramp.

Between 1957 and 1959 he did RAF National Service in Gutesloh, Germany where he was trained in Radar, giving him a new career in Electronics.

John then worked at Pye in Electronics.

John married Janet on 24th September 1960 in St Peters Church, Streatham, London.

They made their first home in a flat on Amersham Hill in High Wycombe. He enjoyed playing rugby for Old Verulamians in Hatfield. His kit was all white which was an interesting choice considering they didn't have a washing machine at that time, so there were many buckets of soapy water needed.


Christine was born at home in July 1962 and Sandra in February 1965.

By now John was working at Instron, as an Electronics Engineer making Tensile Test machines, where he stayed for nearly 30 years.

New houses were being built in Chinnor for the affordable price of £3000, so they found out where that was and swiftly decided that was the place for them.

John and Janet moved to Chinnor in 1965.

During this time John enjoyed playing competition level badminton as Instron had a very strong sports and social club which John thoroughly enjoyed being involved in. Spending many evenings with his friends of the sports and social team creating the elaborate decorations for the dinner dance, social club functions and the children's parties. Christine and Sandra fondly remember those exciting themed parties and even when they were older helping paint and create the decorations. The most



memorable being the massive T-Rex dinosaur which moved and roared when anyone entered the building. Father Christmas entered once on a zip wire after the children had to guess where and when he was going to arrive. This all reflected the clever electronics John and his friends were expert at.

John was an active member for many years with Christian Aid, and at one point becoming chairman. He enjoyed doing the test walks ahead of the charity events with his big black collie cross, Tim. Ensuring it was only he that had to wallow through the mud and not the walkers.

He enjoyed having dogs in the family home over the years and taking long walks over the Chinnor hills, usually ending in a pub lunch. He also revelled in an allotment for about 4 years and helped Janet with involvement in Hearing Dogs for deaf people.

John had an active life in this church being confirmed in 1997 and then he became a church warden a position of which he was extremely proud, and got great enjoyment from.

John thoroughly enjoyed family holidays with his four grand children: Tom, Rosie, Alice and Andrew. And was very proud of them all. Alice has fond memories of center parcs holidays where Grandad taught her badminton and that he even once knitted a small blanket for her doll - a new skill for him. For Andrew, it was Grandad's physics ability that came in handy when he needed help with homework. Tom remembers Grandad getting more chatty after some wine at Christmas lunch and telling him how he was flown back to England from Germany in the bomb bay of an aircraft.

During journeys in the car with Rosie, the Beatles would often be playing of which Let it Be was a favourite.

Do you know what to do when you receive a Scam text/email/call?

Age UK Oxfordshire offers a free support service for people to help keep them safe from the scams which seem to assail us on an almost daily basis. We were delighted to have been able to have two meetings in Chinnor with Mandy Massam from Age UK Oxfordshire, who is their specialist in Scam Awareness, one in September sponsored and hosted by the Chinnor Parish Council, and the other sponsored and hosted by Chinnor Methodist Church, many thanks to both of them.

Mandy explained what we should be doing when we are in receipt of scams. If you get a scam text message DON'T CLICK ON ANY LINKS you have not requested. We should forward ALL scam texts to 7726, then Block and Delete the message.

If you get a scam email – if it's an offer that is too good to be true, it's a Scam, DON'T CLICK ON ANY LINKS. Forward the email to report@phishing.gov.uk, and NEVER reply to them.

If you get an incoming call, either landline or mobile from a number you don't recognise, answer it but DON'T SAY ANYTHING, until the person the other end speaks. The incoming call is probably being made by an automated system, if you don't answer the system will assume it's not a valid phone number, if you answer but don't speak the system will assume the same; as soon as you speak the system knows your number has connected, and you get put through to a scammer.

If you have been scammed, call you Bank Fraud Dept immediately using the number on the back of your bank card or by dialling 159. 159 is a national central call number (like 999, 111 etc) and connects you to the real Fraud Depts of all the major High Street banks. Put the number for your bank as well as 159 into the Contacts List on your mobile phone.

If you want to know more call the Age UK Oxfordshire Advice Line on 0345 450 1276, they can help with so many things and are quite willing to do home visits, which are free of charge.
