What is it like inside the building?

Kitchen area - This is where you can get a drink and a snack after the service.

There is tea, coffee, water or squash. We usually have cake or biscuits to eat!

These are provided by volunteers and you don't need to pay for them.


Organ - This is where our hymn music is played from on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.

It makes a lot of notes at once and it isn't connected to the sound system.

Toilet - Toilet and sink. This can be used at any point during the service or before and after. It is always available unless someone else is using it.

Seating area - You are very welcome to sit here during the service, if you need more space around you. Children are welcome to play in this space during the service. This space is used before or after the service to socialise.

Vestry - This is the room the vicar and ministry team use before the service. There is also an emergency exit here.



Chancel and altar - This is where the vicar and the other ministry team members will speak from. It is slightly raised so you can see them from the seating areas. (They will speak through a microphone which is connected to the loop hearing system.) During Communion, this is where those who want to take Communion or receive a blessing will come and stand or kneel.

Entrance and exit - This is the way in and out of the building. First you enter a porch and then you go through a big wooden door which is normally closed to keep the warmth in. When you come in, someone will greet you and give you a hymn book and order of

service.

Pews (seating) - There are two sections of seating called pews. They are long benches in rows. You can sit in any of these during the service. Unless it is a special busy, service such as Easter or Christmas, there is normally enough space choose to sit near other people or on your own. If you would rather have space around you, it is fine to sit or stand in the seating area near the kitchen.
