It has become increasingly challenging to keep the season of Advent. In our modern world the season of Christmas has now extended back to November and has somewhat swallowed up Advent.

Advent is very similar to Lent and that is evidenced by the colour of purple which is used for both seasons. In church we have our Advent wreaths and we light a candle each Sunday to help us to remember amongst other things, that before the birth of Jesus, the world was in darkness; however, that all changes when Christ, the light of the world, is born.

Advent is a time for us to reflect and to prepare for the birth of Jesus; it is an important period of waiting and anticipation.

Waiting is something that our society is increasingly struggling to do. We have all become accustomed to getting things instantly and not having to wait for them.

Our society has changed dramatically since the invention of email. In past times we would write letters to each other and not expect a reply for days. For Christians, Advent is that opportunity to prepare and to wait; and then to celebrate on 25<sup>th</sup> December when we will give thanks for the birth of the Son of God and the Saviour of the world. The waiting and preparation beforehand enhances this joyful experience. To help us to prepare for Christmas, I shall be leading a bible study at the **New Victory Hall on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup>, December, starting at 1.30pm.** Please do come along for a relaxed and informal opportunity that will help all of us prepare for the upcoming joys of Christmas.

Finally, I pray that you will all have a good and fruitful Advent; and that when the time comes and the waiting is over, a very joyful Christmas.



#### **Road Closures**

The road closures in the village are highly disruptive. If there are any concerns or issues with the road closure signs or notices, or the lighting isn't working, please contact Norfolk County Council on their out of hours number: 0344 800 8020. The Council does work hard to ensure that there are no unnecessary road closures and that, where possible, works from different companies can be coincided to prevent unnecessary closures. The majority of the upcoming closures over the coming months are City Fibre works and BT /OpenReach.

#### **Penny Wort in the broads**

The Broads Authority is asking river users and the local community to be on the look-out for an outbreak of the floating pennywort on the River Ant but asks that if found, not to disturb it. Here is a link to an image of pennywort.

The aggressively invasive floating pennywort (*Hydrocotyle ranunculoides*) has been seen locally. The plant spreads rapidly in water and can grow up to 20cm a



day, creating a dense raft of vegetation, which clogs up streams and rivers.

The floating pennywort is such a successful invader that just a single fragment of it drifting downstream can soon dominate an expanse of water. It outcompetes native aquatic plants, blocking out the light they need, leading to the loss of native plants and a sterile river ecosystem.

#### **Avian Flu**

Following national developments regarding bird flu, the Broads Authority is issuing a reminder of the current guidance which members of the public and landowners should follow.

DEFRA is the governing body that issues the national biosecurity guidelines the BA is following, and their strong advice is that the public should not touch or pick

up any dead or visibly sick birds that they find, whether this is in the Broads area or beyond.

Current guidance states you should either report dead wild birds on the DEFRA website - https://www.gov.uk/guidance/report-dead-wild-birds - or call the helpline on 03459 33 55 77.

Alternatively, call the RSPCA on 0300 1234 999 if you find birds which are alive but are in distress or are visibly sick/unwell.

#### Horning Village Hall

By the time you read this, the new doors should be installed in the Mill Suite and the insulation of the north side of the Mill Suite should be complete. Hopefully, this will mean a slightly warmer Mill Suite than hitherto during the coming winter and much easier access for all. There is some additional work necessary but this will be outside rather than in.

The trustees have been considering an improvement program for the main hall itself. The main hall, like all of us, is getting older and while it is generally in good condition, much of its infrastructure is somewhat dated and needs to be brought firmly into the 21<sup>st</sup>-century. There would appear to be 3 projects initially for the main hall, these are repair of the roof, installation of a ventilation system appropriate for the hall and renovation/insulation of the front entrance of the hall. The trustees will be researching each of these in the New Year with a view to developing a programme of ongoing works subject, of course, to the availability of finance.

Marky Mark's Music Quiz on 15 November was in aid of the restoration work at the Village Hall. It was a superb evening and well attended; it produced a significant sum of money towards ongoing work at the village hall. Thank you Mark for all your efforts in support of the Village Hall.

Mark is running another such event on 10 December 2025, again in support of the Village Hall. The doors open at 7 PM and the cost will be £5 per person payable at the door.
