



Dear Friends,

As the New Year dawns many of us will find ourselves looking back on the joys and sorrows of the old year. There is a lull that comes after Christmas Day that naturally encourages such reflection. After all the build up to 25th December we might experience this pause with quiet relief, but we may also experience an anti-climax, perhaps even a touch of the “January blues”, if we do, hopefully they will be fleeting as we embrace the tantalising opportunity for a fresh start. I am still wedded to an old-fashioned paper diary and I love the neat blank pages - empty for now but full of possibilities.

The church already has a few things in its diary for January. We would love for you to join us. Epiphany falls on the 6th of the month, the date when most peoples’ decorations come down. There is troubling news of a toxic spill during mining operations in Zambia's Copperbelt into the Kafue river. See <https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/articles/cj6nly288j4o> This spillage occurred in the part of Zambia where our link church is situated.



Looking at the map, I assume that Mufulira and Kamuchanga are not downstream of the spillage, so hopefully not directly affected. They may be indirectly affected. Joseph Mwenya now lives in Kitwe, which is on the Kafue river. He has told me that a few months ago they were affected by toxic chemicals and had no water for about a month. Children could not go to school until they were told that the water was good to use.

Joseph also says, "Thank you for your support and prayers our wedding went well."

Time to learn to pray

‘Lord, teach us to pray.’ In Luke’s Gospel it’s these words, spoken by the disciples, that cause Jesus to give them the Lord’s Prayer (Luke 11:1-4). Jesus says to his friends ‘When you pray say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each our daily bread. And forgive

us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.’

Many of us think that we should be able to pray automatically. And that if we can’t, it’s either because ‘it’s not our thing’ or because we’re failing. Yet in Luke’s Gospel, the disciples still need to ask Jesus how to pray, even after they’ve been knocking around with him for ages. So maybe we should give ourselves a break and accept that working out how to pray is not obvious and that all of us need to learn.

In 2026, I’m asking all of us across our diocese of Bath and Wells to make the year one of especial focus on prayer. I’m hoping we’ll all be able to say the words ‘Lord teach us to pray’ and that together we’ll all grow in our experience, understanding, insight and practice.

How can we learn about prayer? We have to make a start. We need to make some mistakes. We need to learn from others. It doesn’t happen in the abstract. Prayer is a ‘learning by doing thing’ where if we stick at it, we grow and change.

How might you learn to pray more this year? There isn’t a master plan designed to get everyone on their knees. Most action will happen locally where we can identify what we need, work out who can help us, and then get underway. Some simple resources designed to be helpful are being made available. More importantly, please do talk to your vicar or other church leaders about what might be possible where you are.

Together, let’s say these words in the year that is to come:

‘Lord, teach us to pray.’ A very happy New Year to you all.

Driving an ambulance to Ukraine to help save lives

Mighty Convoy (MC) is a not-for-profit charitable organisation and its aim is to raise funds for the purchase and delivery of second-hand ambulances and 4x4 pick-up trucks packed with medical supplies to Ukraine. MC has partnered with ICMDA in the UK and the Christian Medical Association Ukraine (CMAU) in Lviv, which is where the vehicles are delivered.

Everyone involved is a volunteer, including all drivers, who not only volunteer their time but also pay for their own expenses and flights home. So far, MC has organised 20 convoys to Ukraine, raised over £500,000, and donated over 80 ambulances and pick-up trucks, plus lots of aid.

It costs £7000 to buy an ambulance or pick-up truck and drive it to Ukraine. These vehicles and equipment are making a huge impact in a country that continues to be in desperate need of our support.

I am raising funds to buy and drive an ambulance or pick-up truck with a friend on the journey of approximately three days in January 2026. To do this we need to raise £7,000 to pay for the vehicle, fuel, insurance and passage. The aid we will take is donated.

Ukraine, right now, as you know, is in dire need of help in its fight against Russia and this is the best way I can help in a practical and direct way. And what an adventure it will be!

My 2026 hope is to get as many pieces of our work as possible into the pastoral care areas of Somerset schools.



