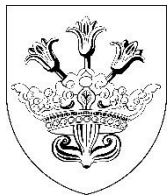

## **We sit for the Sermon**

## **We prepare for the Baptism**

*Those to be baptised and their Parents and God parents gather at the Altar*

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.

We thank God for ...

who has come to be baptised today.

Christ loves him and welcomes him into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support this child as he begins his journey of faith?

**We will.**

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family?  
**We will.**

*The Priest addresses the parents and Godparents*

God knows each of us by name and we are his.  
Parents and Godparents, you speak for ... today.  
Will you pray for him and help him to follow Christ?

*Parents and Godparents*      **We will**

### **We renew our promises**

*The Priest addresses the parents and Godparents and, today, as we recall our own Baptism invites all who are baptised to renew our own Baptismal Promises.*

We all wander far from God and lose our way:  
Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.  
In baptism we respond to his call.  
Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin?

**I do.**

Do you reject evil?

**I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

**I do.**

Do you trust in him as Lord?

**I do.**

### **The Signing with the Cross**

*The Priest, using oil blest by the Bishop for this purpose,*

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.  
Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.  
**Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil,  
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,  
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

**Amen.**

## **The Water is Blessed**

*The Priest asks God to bless the water for the baptism*

**Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*The Priest says the prayer of blessing.*

## **We profess our faith**

Brothers and sisters, let us affirm,  
together with these who are being baptised,  
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,  
source of all being and life,  
the one for whom we exist?

**I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,  
who took our human nature,  
died for us and rose again?

**I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit,  
who gives life to the people of God  
and makes Christ known in the world?

**I believe and trust in him.**

This is the faith of the Church.

**This is our faith.**

**We believe and trust in one God,  
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

*Those to be baptised have water poured over them three times. After a prayer the Priest sprinkles the congregation with water from the font to remind them of their Baptism and the renewal of their commitment today. Those baptised return to the Altar with the Priest. As you are sprinkled it is tradition to make the sign of the cross.*

*During the sprinkling we sing:*

Now is eternal life,  
if risen with Christ we stand,  
in him to life reborn,  
and, held within his hand;  
no more we fear death's ancient dread,  
in Christ arisen from the dead!

Unfathomed love divine,  
reign thou within my heart;  
from thee nor depth nor height,  
nor life nor death can part;  
our life is hid in God with thee,  
now and through all eternity.

## **As the Altar is prepared we sing the hymn**

*The Priest continues praying that the Spirit may come upon the gifts and recalling the action of Jesus at the Last Supper*

Christ is the bread of life:

**when we eat this bread and drink this cup,  
we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,  
until you come in glory.**

*The Priest continues the prayer, at the end all respond*

**Amen.**

**We pray as Jesus taught us**

**Our Father, who art in heaven  
Hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come;  
Thy will be done: on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
As we forgive those who trespass against us.  
Lead us not into temptation;  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the Kingdom, the power, and the glory,  
for ever and ever.   Amen.**

*As communion is distributed, wherever you are, pray that you may be aware of Christ's presence with you and that you will be blessed and comforted by it*

*During Communion the Choir will sing an anthem.*

*At the end of Communion we all sing the Communion hymn*

The sinless one to Jordan came  
to share our fallen nature's blame;  
God's righteousness he thus fulfilled
