## The art of good listening

Really good listening is a skill that takes all of us a significant amount of time to practice and develop. Good listening is often described as a form or art; and just as an artist will take many years to hone and refine their skills, the same can also be said for a good listener.

Jesus was a good listener.

The bible records relatively few words spoken by Jesus. Christ would often instead listen to people, discern the situation, and then share his wisdom.

It is often a challenge for us to become good listeners as we have to push back on our own needs, and instead, be present and in the moment to support the person who is talking to us. However, good listening is a wonderful skill, and one that if we can grow and develop, will allow our own lives, and also the lives of the people around us to improve and flourish.

At the core, good listening requires us to be selfless; to put someone else's needs before our own.

Good listening means giving someone else our full attention, and we can all instinctively and immediately tell if someone is giving us that. There can be very obvious clues they there are not, such as if the other person is looking at their phone whilst we are trying to talk to them. To the more subtle, but still identifiable clues, such as how the other person responds to us; typically with single word answers which indicate that they are not really engaging with the conversation.

Another challenge that we have to navigate to become a good listener is the temptation to take over the conversation. The more we talk, the less we hear.

Sometimes it can be really hard to give another person our full attention and to be a good listener. We might have other things that we need to do, jobs to complete, places to go; we can all feel the stresses of time commitments and deadlines. However, being a good listener for someone who really needs to talk will almost certainly be our number one priority, other tasks can normally wait.

I have a personal rule where I try at all costs never to use the word 'busy' to describe how my day or my week is going. When someone thinks a person is 'busy' they then almost apologise for requesting a small piece of your time. Listening to people, supporting people, being there for people when they are in need, is far more important than our day-to-day chores which we often mistakenly feel are essential and vital, when in fact they can often easily be delayed.

Life is always about priorities; and being a good listener to those around us is surely one of our top priorities.

## Precept

Horning Parish Council has opted to keep the precept as low as possible for the forthcoming financial year, despite significant increases in costs beyond its control, including rising insurance premiums, higher national insurance contributions, and general inflation. The increase for 2025/26 will be less than £5 per year for a Band D household—amounting to a total rise of only £6 over the past three years. Throughout this period, the Parish Council has continued to provide all its usual services, from maintaining public spaces and supporting community facilities to ensuring local issues are heard and addressed. Parish councils increasingly shoulder more responsibilities as district and county councils face ongoing financial pressures and organisational challenges, and Horning Parish Council remains committed to working hard on behalf of parishioners to support the village and protect the services that matter most.

We know that you can see all these films on TV/Netflix etc from the comfort of your own home-but the point is that by coming to the Horning Cinema, viewing on the "big screen" is a different experience and, more importantly, you can meet up and have a chat with your neighbours. It costs us a licence fee for each

showing and if we do not get enough people attending, it costs us money. In recent months, attendance has been very poor, sometimes in spite of some quite outstanding films. If this does not change, we shall have to reconsider the future of the cinema. It is the old adage, "Use it or lose it!"

The Horning Cinema 2026 new season starts on Friday February 13th with the film "UNSTOPPABLE" (2010) Certificate 12A. Running time 98 minutes. Based on a real incident and starring Rosario Dawson, Chris Pine, Mimi Rogers and Denzel Washington.

### **Other news.....**

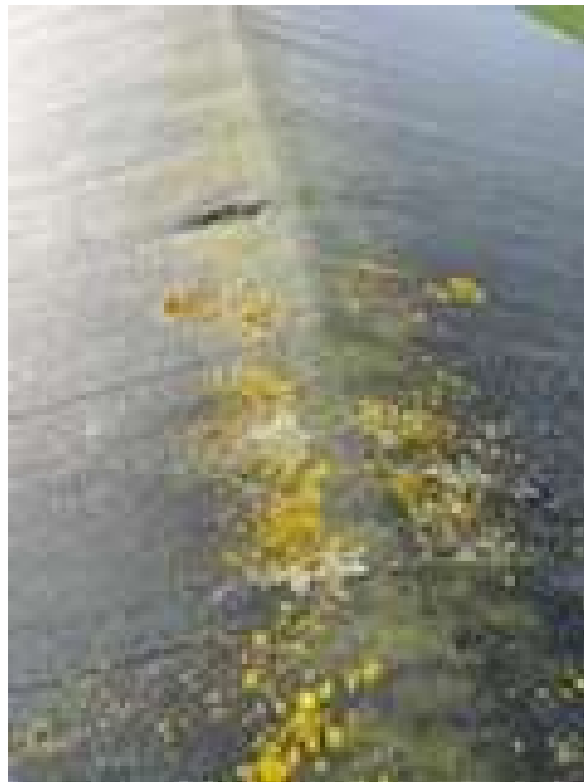
There is a hole in the village hall roof! It is only a small one but it is still a hole. As we have reported previously the ridge of the hall roof is in relatively poor condition while the remainder of the roof is satisfactory but will benefit from a clean. At the moment, we are collecting our estimates for the remedial work.

Also, the front entrance of the village hall is looking very scruffy. There is significant rot in some of the cladding timbers and the generally untidy appearance of the upper windows does not help. Since the upper windows at the front of the village hall do not serve any useful purpose (they are

permanently blacked out), it is proposed to cover these in white plastic with substantial insulation behind. The present name board will be replaced with a raised one suitably illuminated. We also propose redecorating the front of the hall and if funds run to it, double glazing to avoid the problems of condensation presently experienced.

Lastly we are looking at the ventilation of the main hall. This will be a significant project; at the moment, the trustees are conducting a research exercise to find out what is reasonably practicable and possible at a cost that we are likely to be able to afford.

To help fund this work, we are proposing a fund-raising event towards the end of June. We need your support, so please watch this space.....

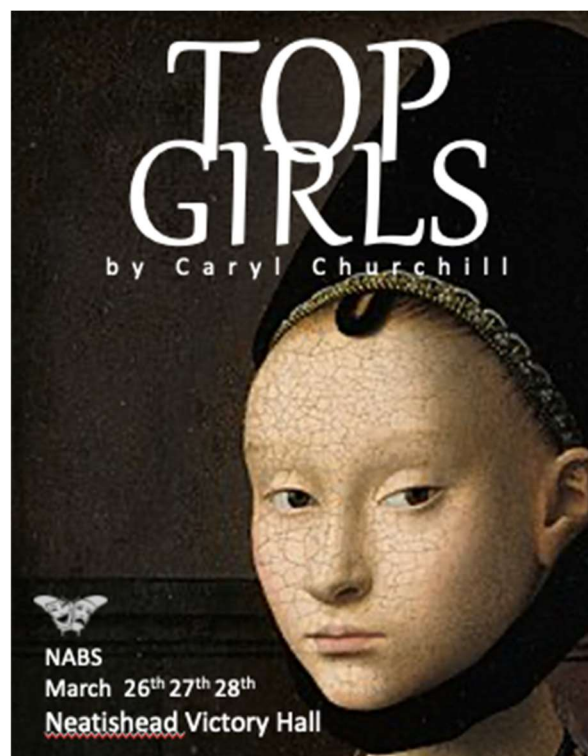

Now, a message from this year's Club President, Past District Governor Lion Dennis Moxon. This year Wroxham & Hoveton Lions Club reaches, not one, but two major milestones. Firstly, the Club itself celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, but as well as that 2025 is also the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Lions Charity Shop, located in the Riverside Precinct in Hoveton.

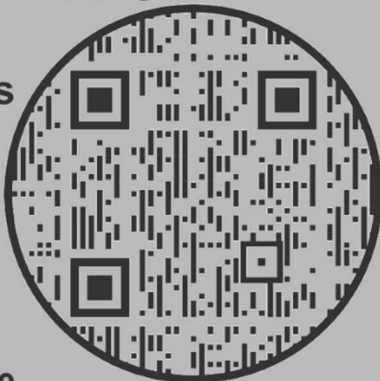
