# What's ahead in 2026

Vision2030 is gaining momentum, **building on the vibrant life of St Mary's**, the wonderful **commitment of volunteers** and **many ministries that shape our church week by week**. Our Mission Action Plan describes how we will achieve our vision in four areas: **faith, community, world** and **stewardship**. Key activities planned in 2026 are outlined below.

## Faith

*We seek to deepen our spiritual life through inspiring worship and opportunities to explore our faith, helping us grow in numbers*

- **Growing in faith:** running a young choristers formation course, study group retreat (June) and preparing candidates for confirmation (April)
- **Lent and Advent:** lay led preaching, sharing personal faith experiences
- **Pastoral care and hospitality:** developing welcome, support and volunteer ministries
- **Patterns of worship:** exploring additional ways of worship alongside our much-loved choral tradition to help welcome those new to church
- **Partnerships:** joint Anglican services and civic worship such as Blue Christmas, NHS Carol Service and Remembrance Sunday

## Community

*We seek to be at the heart of our community, offering hospitality and support, grounded in faith*

- **Social impact centre:** opening a town centre community hub to offer advice, support and hospitality (March)
- **Practical support:** launching the Merry-Go-Round Clothing Library (March), continuing Singing for Mums, support of refugees and Packmores Estate ministry, supporting Warwick Hospital chaplaincy
- **Events:** Rectory Garden Party (July), Dog Show (July), Teddy Bear Parachute Drop and Community Picnic, Christmas Tree Festival (December)
- **Civic partnerships:** hosting the Warwickshire Change Makers Ceremony in partnership with Warwick Castle and Warwick County Council (July)

## World

*We seek to work for God's kingdom by helping build a more just and peaceful world*

- **Peace-building:** forming a Peace-builders Group (March), becoming a Global Centre for Peace-building and Business (GCPB) Cornerstone Church, hosting the Warwick Peace-builders Festival (May)
- **Global links:** welcoming a priest from Ghana to share with our ministry and supporting communities such as in Madagascar and Tanzania
- **Chaplaincy:** our rector continuing to serve as padre to Military Intelligence

## Stewardship

*We seek to operate sustainably, securing the people and resources needed to fulfill our mission*

- **Gifts and giving:** Lent Stewardship Campaign
- **Fabric:** submitting a Heritage Lottery Fund application to support restoration and reordering, develop a new hall, and explore environmental sustainability
- **Events:** delivering a vibrant programme that engages new audiences and generates income
- **Staff:** appointing an associate rector and welcome manager to support our growing ministry (Sept)
- **Digital communications:** launching a new church website (March)
