## St Edward's Christmas Appeal – THANK YOU

Forever Angels is based in Tanzania, and provides interim care for orphaned babies until a permanent family can be found. Maisha Matters, part of the charity, supports orphaned babies in their own homes with life-saving formula milk whilst empowering their families through business creation and education.

The donation will go to support some of the families and infants they care for, especially following the recent riots and unrest after the election. This is a photo of a typical Maisha Matters group, where the families and caregivers come to Forever Angels each week, to receive support and baby formula, as well as learning about such issues as Malaria, HIV, childcare etc.

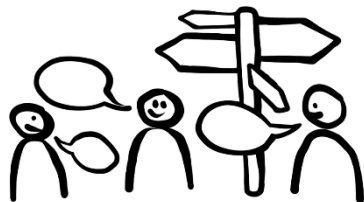


### Please pray for:

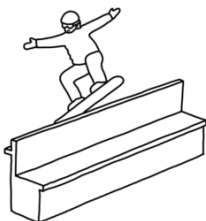
## Foodbank

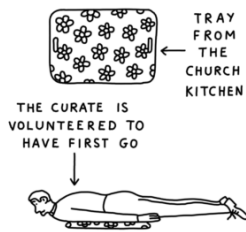

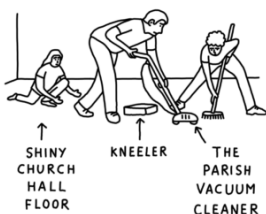

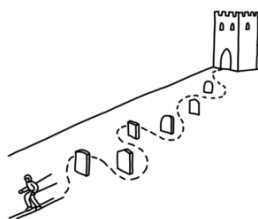
