Today's hymns are...

3 A man there lived in Galilee

Somerset Corry Lowry was the writer of this hymn which was published in 1926 just six years before his death. Each verse, in turn, neatly marks the birth, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.

532 We have a gospel to proclaim

This hymn was written in 1968 by Edward Burns for a "Call to Mission" in Blackburn Diocese. Verses 2-5 encapsulate Incarnation, Crucifixion, Resurrection and Pentecost.

231 I heard the voice

Written by Horatius Bonar in the 19th century, this hymn invites us to come to Jesus, offering rest and spiritual renewal. The words reflect the comforting message of Jesus's invitation found in the gospels of Matthew and John.

473 The church's one foundation

Samuel Stone wrote this hymn in response to Bishop John Colenso's outrageous claim that much of the Holy Bible was fictitious. We sang it often at the end of our annual walking day and it was used to emotional effect in the last scene of the film "One Foot in Heaven." The tune Aurelia was composed by Samuel Wesley, son of Charles.

Acts 10 34-43

Then Peter began to speak to them: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan, to be baptised by him. ¹⁴John would have prevented him, saying, 'I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?' ¹⁵But Jesus answered him, 'Let it be so now; for it is proper for us in this way to fulfil all righteousness.' Then he consented. ¹⁶And when Jesus had been baptised, just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. ¹⁷And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.'
