As many of you will know, Esther and I were offered the opportunity to move into St. Matthew's Vicarage and made that move between Christmas and New Year. The 10.30 Eucharist – what on earth's going on?

We may have been coming to St. Matthew's for decades; we may only have been coming for a short time. Perhaps we come week-in- week-out, perhaps less often. Whatever - sometimes, we can actually forget what it's really about, and how important the Eucharist is. Or we might suddenly find ourselves wondering why we do one particular thing – or even any of it!

This year, on four Sundays in Lent, the sermon-slot will be exploring, unpacking the Eucharist. And there's so much to explore! There are two layers to this: what's going on in the sense of, say, why we 'process' the Gospel; but the much deeper, mystical, spiritual 'what is actually going on at the altar' - what happens to the bread and wine.

It's a fair observation that the Jesus who sat at table with his friends, on the first 'Maundy Thursday' evening, might wonder how we've got to '10.30 at St. Matthew's'! So we'll look at how things have developed from Last Supper to 'High Mass', and see how 'what we do' depends on 'what we believe'. And I hope we'll come to admire the way Church of England Eucharists allow us all to have slightly different ways of looking at things, yet still worship together in unity.

If, after hearing the talks, you have questions (or if you already have!) any of the clergy will be delighted to chat them through with you. We aren't telling you what to believe; we're just longing for your experience of Sunday worship to grow deeper and wider, and to bring you greater and greater joy.

The word *Eucharist* simply means *thanksgiving*, and I hope that this journey of exploration will lead us all to give deeper, more joyful thanks for all that God has done - and continues to do - for us, through Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Who will, without a doubt, continue to be with us every Sunday morning!

Fr. Rod writes Exploring Healing

At the Parish Eucharist for Epiphany the figures of the wise men were placed in the crib and their gifts were symbolically celebrated. For the gift of myrrh we heard this prayer offered:

Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe:
to you be praise and glory for ever.
As you give medicine to heal our sickness
and the leaves of the tree of life
for the healing of the nations,
so anoint us with your healing power
that we may be the first-fruits of your new creation.
Blessed be God for ever.

The prayer asks specifically that we be 'anointed with healing power'. In response to God's call to follow the ministry of Christ the Healer we are continuing to explore and develop the ministry of healing at St Matthew's, and we will be offering opportunities to receive prayer and/or anointing in our services over the coming months.

At the Parish Eucharist on **Sunday 8th February** and **Sunday 8th March** we will offer this prayer as part of our eucharistic liturgy. We hope to continue with this pattern **every second Sunday** of the month.

At the **Friday morning Eucharist** there will also be opportunities to receive prayer on a regular basis, probably once a fortnight. Look out for information on the weekly bulletin.

Our Parish Prayers which take place every **Thursday evening at 7pm** also provide a space to explore the ministry of Christian healing, and once a month we will follow the formal prayers with a time of teaching and conversation about this ministry which all are welcome to. The next date will be **Thursday 26th February**.



Many aspects of the church's worship have a healing dimension. At each Eucharist we say a prayer of confession and hear the words of absolution as we bring before God our sins, failings and weaknesses. There are times when we can be troubled by these things and, whilst the shared confession of our public worship does give us real assurance of forgiveness, we might need to benefit from the invitation to share with a priest, in confidence and to hear the priest pronounce God's forgiveness to us personally. Those of us who have experienced this can testify to the profound spiritual healing it brings. The priests at St Matthew's want you to know that the ministry of sacramental confession, perhaps more accurately known now as the sacrament of reconciliation, is always available for any who need it. If you're unsure then have a quiet word about it. All priests are able to offer this ministry. I am also a member of Bishop Philip's College of Confessors, having received some additional training recently which focused on such matters as confidentiality, safeguarding and good practice.

The Christian healing ministry is non-intrusive, respectful, pastoral and compassionate. It is available as a means of grace and all are invited to receive at whatever level they choose.

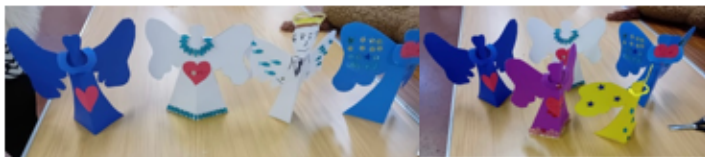


Biscuit pledges to practise how to hear God's voice

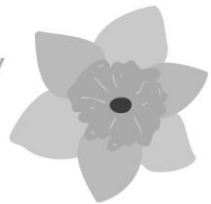

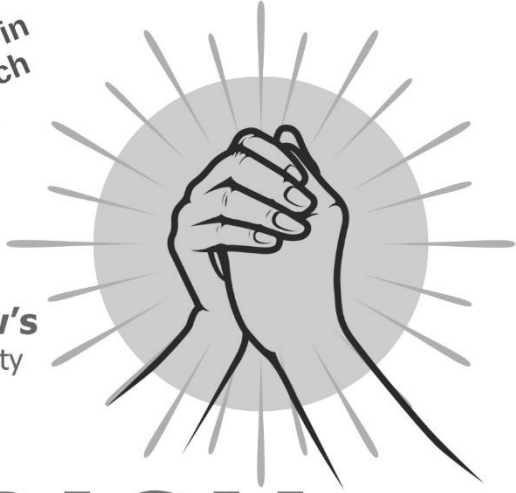

Eco Church News

Last October, I attended Blackburn Cathedral's first ever Creation Care Conference. It was a very interesting and encouraging weekend. The Diocese is committed to achieving 100 Parishes with an Eco Church Bronze Award. In Burnley, St Matthew's and St Stephen's both achieved this last year. One of the talks I attended was by a Church in Clitheroe that recently achieved its Gold Award. Although the idea of St Matthew's reaching this level is way into the future, I did pick a few interesting ideas about easy ways for individuals to be more environmentally friendly:

1. switch your Browser (usually Google or one of the other big names) to Ecosia. I use it on my phone and tablet and it works as well as any other search engine. 'We use all our profits for climate action, with the majority going into tree-planting projects around the world.'
2. next time your mobile phone contract runs out, consider switching to Eco Talk . It describes itself as 'the world's first mobile network to use its profits to restore nature.'
3. Phone Apps are a fun accessible way to find out more about wildlife. I particularly like the Merlin App which accurately identifies birdsong for you. I've used it in Scott Park early in the morning and was amazed what was around, including the tiny rare Goldcrest. There are several good ones for wildflower recognition too. iNaturalist is my favourite.

Medicine Blister Packs Collection

Many thanks to the enthusiastic recyclers out there. We are now well on the way to filling our 3rd bag. These are packaged up and sent to Terracycle for processing into useful new products. It would be a great help to me if you removed the rubber bands or small plastic bags that some people include: it would then also mean you could re-use them for sending in your next collection! Unfortunately, this service is not free. I would appreciate any donations towards the cost of buying the bags.

Fundraising

Because St Matthew's struggles to cover its running costs, any money we wish to dedicate to environmental projects such as bee-friendly wildflower planters will need to be raised specifically by ourselves. It has been suggested to me that some people would be willing to increase their regular giving to support

the Eco Church programme. If this is so, please could you have a word with myself or Howard, the Church Treasurer, to arrange for this amount to be credited regularly to Eco Church.

Our first ever Christmas Market stall raised £62. We sold Charity Christmas cards, bamboo toothbrushes, shampoo bars, and other plastic-free products, plus assorted plants. As a small ongoing fund-raiser, I am looking to have a small permanent plant sale on a trolley in the porch. Donations would be welcome at any time. I have a few daffodil plants which will be available soon, hopefully.

Litterpicking

Because Burnley Council provide the equipment, having regular litter-picking events is a great free way of supporting Eco Church. When the weather improves in the Spring, we will be asking for ideas for new places to clean up. **Please get in touch if you'd like to be more involved in Eco Church.**
