Uneasy lies the head that wears the crown

This is possibly the most famous line across this pair of Shakespeare plays and studies in kingship: *Henry IV Part 2*, Act 3, scene 1.

The head of our newborn king will be lying easy for a good long time yet. Contrast that with the heads of the two King Herods in Jesus's life: Herod the Great, at the time of Jesus's birth, paranoid, jealous and duplicitous; and his weak son, Herod Antipas, outmanoeuvred into serving up the head of John the Baptist on plate— a man whom he had admired—for the sake of honouring a careless promise to a dancing girl.

These Herods were uneasy, insecure people, pushing the limits of their power as puppet kings under Roman puppet masters. They may well have been aware of the essays in kingship found in Isaiah 60.1-12. They were too weak and compromised to adhere to the advice, etched into the memory of Matthew.

The magi (literally 'possessors of mysterious wisdom') are not really kings, but they bring 'kingly' symbols as gifts, and also are models of wise governance: they seek, they find, and they adapt or moderate their expectations, lessons for us all.

Welcome to the Eucharist, also known as Holy Communion or The Mass

This act of worship is a partnership between the priest and the people who:

- greet each other in the Lord's name
- confess their sins and, if repentant, are assured of God's forgiveness
- keep silence and pray a Collect (a special prayer or collection of thoughts for that day)
- proclaim and respond to the word of God in scripture and reflect on it
- pray for the Church, the world and those in need
- exchange the Peace (this should be a simple gesture, not a major interruption to the flow of the service)
- prepare the table (it is only a table, but it becomes an altar)
- pray the Eucharistic Prayer (listen along and pray, and over time these words will become more familiar to you.
- break the bread (which recalls Christ's body, broken on the Cross)
- receive communion (or a blessing instead)
- depart with God's blessing, to go in peace to love and serve the Lord

If you have arrived very late, relax! Sit still and make your confession knowing God understands and loves you. Then read the Gospel, and join us in full when you are ready.

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ
Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— ²for surely you
have already heard of the commission of God's grace
that was given to me for you, ³and how the mystery
was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote
above in a few words, ⁴a reading of which will enable
you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of
Christ. ⁵In former generations this mystery was not
made known to humankind, as it has now been re-
vealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spir-
it: ⁶that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs,
members of the same body, and sharers in the prom-
ise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.
⁷ Of this gospel I have become a servant according to
the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the

the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of

the rulers and authorities in the heavenly plac-
es. ¹¹This was in accordance with the eternal purpose
that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, ¹²in
whom we have access to God in boldness and confi-
dence through faith in him.

Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
