**This month is about—  
“OVERWHELMED”  
By Lynn Mitchell**

We, St Catherine's Home group, gathered at Rev. Caroline Tracey's for our first meeting of 2026, small in number - one person at a medical appointment, one person still unwell after a number of weeks, and one with car problems. We shared our Christmas joys, our family news and our Church family news - health and ageing and mobility problems and wondering what the Lord had in store for us all in 2026 - particularly with the deteriorating world news with invasions, bombings and threats from greedy powerful nations acting with apparent impunity. We then received a text telling us that the Lord had called yet another of our faithful Team Church leaders to glory and our need to support in prayer his lovely wife, the family and friends. We turned to the Day's reading and reflection from Daily Bread about Jesus calling the disciples and the time He spent living with them and guiding them and how important it is to spend time regularly in prayer. We turned to prayer - I was absolutely overwhelmed - where do we start? - the needs are so great! - HOW ON EARTH DO I PRAY?? In the silence we just lifted names and situations to the Lord.

After the meeting, I arrived home and the Prayer letter from **Missionary Aviation Fellowship (MAF)** had just arrived and there in the middle was a superb article entitled " HOW ON EARTH DO I PRAY?? " - written by Jess Soames (Prayer Communications Lead for MAF) which stopped me in my tracks and began to point me in the right direction. Jess says " It is easy to feel paralysed by the scale of global suffering --but Scripture doesn't ask us to carry the weight of the world on our shoulders - it invites us to bring it to the One who already does. (Isaiah 41.10 NKJV). Further on Jess gives us some simple guidance for when we don't know what to pray because the needs are just too great .... "1. **Pray for healing** - for those affected by the crisis or illness to be relieved of pain and anxiety 2. **Pray for those in power** - for God to raise up people of integrity who will lead with wisdom and justice. 3. **Pray for the helpers, the first responders, aid workers and volunteers.** 4. **Pray for the Church** - for Christians to rise up and shine their light in whatever situations they find themselves. And - whenever that feels too much - a whispered " God, your kingdom come, your will be done" is often the most powerful thing we can offer." Thank you, Jess, for reminding us that God is always listening and we are never alone and that prayer changes things - check out James 5.16 and John 16.33. I hope and pray that this helps you as much as it helped me!! *Lyn Mitchell*

This year's preparation session for Admission to Communion for children from across our four churches who are in school Year 5 or higher will be on **Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2026**

**10am-1pm at Holy Trinity.** Children will be admitted in their own church in the weeks which follow.

Any child who has been baptized and is in school years Year 5 upwards can come and join us to discover more about what Holy Communion means. ## WHAT DO HOLY TRINITY CHURCH, WORKHOUSES AND THE GREAT EXHIBITION HAVE IN COMMON?

The answer is John Bird Sumner, the Bishop of Chester who consecrated Holy Trinity in the early 1830s. Though perhaps now forgotten, in his lifetime he was quite a prominent figure in public affairs, including in some ways we might these days look on askance.

He became Bishop of Chester in 1828, and was a keen supporter of the then-current drive to build more churches in response to a growing population and an increasing concentration of people in towns and cities. At the same period he served on the Royal Commission whose report led to the 1834 Poor Law which set up the notorious regimes of Victorian workhouses.

In 1848 he rose to even greater heights, becoming Archbishop of Canterbury. In this role he officiated with a prayer at the opening of the Great Exhibition at the Crystal Palace by Queen Victoria in 1851. His senior position in the Church meant that he was present on other important occasions, and so, for instance, he attended the state funeral of the Duke of Wellington, presided over by the Bishop of London at St. Paul's Cathedral in 1852. Within the Church itself, during his archbishopric, among other things, the Convocations of Canterbury and York assembled, for the first time since 1717, and met regularly thereafter, and he was in the spotlight also by being involved in a then-famous controversy, the 'Gorham case', concerning whether the clergyman George Gorham, who held unconventional views about baptism, should or should not be appointed as a bishop. By the time of his death in 1862, he had, then, been quite heavily engaged in public life, and, paid for by public subscription there is an effigy of him on a memorial in Canterbury cathedral.
