Nominees must be:

- at least sixteen years of age;
- actual communicants;
- on the Electoral Roll of this Parish for at least six months

Proposers and seconders must be on the Electoral Roll of this Parish

No person shall be nominated unless they have signified their consent to serve, or there is in the opinion of the meeting sufficient evidence thereof. No person shall be nominated if they are disqualified from serving by the Church Representation Rules.

*pursuant to Rule 76(1), by providing your email address you are agreeing to :

- (i) receive any communication authorised by or under the CRRs at that email address; and
- (ii) any disclosure of your name and address authorised by or under the CRRs will include your email address.

DISQUALIFICATION (Church Representation Rules Part 7, Rule 68)

A person shall be disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or any synod under these rules if the person:

- (1) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or a joint council if the person is disqualified from being a trustee of a charity (and the disqualification is not subject to a waiver which permits membership of a parochial church council, district church council or joint council).
- (2) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).
- (3) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (with that expression being construed in accordance with Rule 71(2) of the Church Representation Rules).
- (4) A person's disqualification under sub-paragraph (3) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese by giving the person notice in writing.
- (5) A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council if the person has been disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbent (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977.

Note

In order to confirm that you are eligible to act as a charity trustee, all newly elected PCC members will be required to sign a declaration confirming their eligibility to hold office as a charity trustee (i.e. non-disqualification under charity law).

Most newly elected PCC members will also be asked to sign a Fit and Proper Person declaration. A copy of these declarations can be found at

New Year, New Me

With January turning to February, 2026 might already feel like old hat. Long forgotten are the hopeful resolutions made at the beginning of the year: those plans to be less wasteful and more conscientious about our environmental impact; those firm intentions to be more generous and forgiving in our interactions with others; those hopes for being gentler with ourselves, trying to make time in our busy lives for our physical, mental and spiritual well-being. By now, the reality of things is likely to have caught up with us, our dreams of a “new year, new me” drowned out by the ordinariness of our day-to-day lives, our many anxieties and worries. Much of the energy and enthusiasm with which we might have set out into the new year is likely to have worn off, not unlike many of the new toys and oh-so-exciting (oh-so-expensive!) Christmas gifts now discarded, broken and forgotten.

Mindful of how quickly we lose sight of our hopes and visions, I've been particularly struck this year by one of the special prayers that we have been using at St Edward's throughout the first few weeks of January:

Lord Jesus Christ,
in you the Father makes us and all things new.

Transform the poverty of our nature

by the riches of your grace,
and in the renewal of our lives
make known your heavenly glory.

Amen.

This prayer speaks powerfully of God's capacity to bring new life. The One who created all things in the beginning, so our Christian faith assures us, continues to make all things new. Creation isn't, as we might instinctively believe, a one-off, once-in-a-lifetime event, but Creation is an ongoing process. Our God is in the business of working change - not for the sake novelty-value, because our God is somehow bored, but in order to bring blessing. As the prayer words it so beautifully, God longs to transform our human poverty in order that all people might come to encounter and enjoy God's heavenly glory, made visible in our lives.

When you find yourselves exhausted, wearied, or "stuck" in the months ahead, deflated, lacking vision and energy, anxious and uncertain about the future, may this prayer offer you strength and reassurance. May we all find new hope in the knowledge that our life together here in this community, no matter what, is ever held in the loving hands of our creator God: transformed and renewed by the riches of God immeasurable grace, today, tomorrow, and every day of our lives.

FROM THE CHURCHWARDENS MEASURE 2001:

1. The churchwardens of every parish shall be chosen from persons who have been baptised and -
 - a. whose names are on the church electoral roll of the parish;
 - b. who are actual communicants;
 - c. who are twenty - one {21} years of age or upwards; and
 - d. who are not disqualified as laid out below.
2. No person shall be chosen as churchwarden of a parish for any period of office unless they -
 - a. have signified consent to serve as such; and
 - b. have not signified consent to serve as such for the same period of office in any other parish (not being a related parish) or, if such consent has been signified and the meeting of the parishioners to elect churchwardens of that other parish has been held, was not chosen as churchwarden of that other parish.

Disqualifications

3. A person shall be disqualified from being chosen for the office of churchwarden if:
 - a. A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a churchwarden or a member of a parochial church council, a district church council or a joint council if the person is disqualified from being a trustee of a charity (and the disqualification is not subject to a waiver which permits membership of a parochial church council, district church council or joint council).
 - b. A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person is included in a barred list (within the meaning of the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups Act 2006).
 - c. A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council, a district church council, a joint council or a deanery synod if the person has been convicted of an offence mentioned in Schedule 1 to the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 (with that expression being construed in accordance with Rule 71(2) of the Church Representation Rules).
 - d. A person's disqualification under sub-paragraph (3) may be waived by the bishop of the diocese by giving the person notice in writing.
 - e. A person is disqualified from being nominated, chosen or elected or from serving as a member of a parochial church council if the person has been disqualified from holding office under section 10(6) of the Incumbent (Vacation of Benefices) Measure 1977. Without prejudice to the above, a person shall be disqualified from being chosen for the office of churchwarden when that person has served as a churchwarden of the same parish for six successive periods of office until the annual meeting of the parishioners to elect churchwardens in the next year but one following the date on which that person vacated office at the end of the last such period: Provided that a meeting of the parishioners may by resolution decide that this section shall not apply in relation to the parish concerned.

Note

In order to confirm that you are eligible to act as a charity trustee, all newly elected Church Wardens will be required to sign two declarations, being: (i) confirmation of trustee eligibility (i.e. non-disqualification under charity law); and (ii) a Fit and Proper Person declaration, copies of which can be found at www.parishresources.org.uk/pccs/apcems/. By confirming that you are eligible for election, you are confirming that you will be able to sign these declarations.

General matters

- 1 The only Churches at present in communion with the Church of England are other Anglican Churches and certain foreign Churches, as listed in the Supplementary Material to the Canons (but note **Rule 83 (3)** of the Church Representation Rules, which provides for any question as to whether a particular Church is in communion with the Church of England to be decided by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York acting jointly).
- 2 Membership of the electoral roll is also open to members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity where those members are also prepared to declare themselves to be members of the Church of England.
- 3 Every six {6} years a new roll is prepared and those on the previous roll are informed so that they can reapply. If you are not resident in the parish but were on the roll as a habitual worshipper and have been prevented by illness or other sufficient cause from worshipping for the past six months, you should complete declaration 2B or 2C as follows –
 - (a) delete the first set of words in square brackets and
 - (b) at the end of the second set of words in square brackets, briefly state the reason for not having worshipped as mentioned.
- 4 If you have any problems with this Form, please approach the clergy or lay people responsible for the parish, who will be pleased to help you.
- 5 In this Form 'parish' means ecclesiastical parish.
- 6 You do not have to provide an email address on this Form. If you do provide one, the Parochial Church Council and the electoral roll officer are entitled to use that email address to communicate with you in connection with the maintenance or revision of the Roll or the preparation of a new Roll or with elections to or membership of the Council.
- 7 The Church Representation Rules impose certain requirements for your name and address to be given to a third party, such as the diocesan electoral registration officer, in connection with elections to or membership of a deanery synod, diocesan synod or the House of Laity of the General Synod. If you provide an email address on this Form, it will be given to the third party along with your postal address.
- 8 A third party to whom your name and address have been given under the Church Representation Rules is in certain cases required by the Rules to pass them on to another person, such as the presiding officer in a synodical election. If you provide an email address on this Form, that email address will be given to the other person along with your postal address.
- 9 Any person to whom your email address or other personal data is given under the Church Representation Rules is required by those Rules to hold the data securely. Furthermore, if you do provide an email address on this Form, that does not give anybody the right to use it for any purpose other than those permitted by the Rules; so it cannot, for example, be used for social matters or fund-raising.
- 10 The roll is published after each annual revision and after the preparation of a new roll. The published roll will include your name (as well as the name of every other person on the roll) but none of your other personal data (as defined by the Data Protection Act 2018) will be made public as a result of your inclusion on the roll.

Notice is hereby given

that the Church Electoral Roll of the above parish will be revised by the Parochial Church Council, beginning on Sunday the 22nd day of February 2026, and ending on Thursday the 5th day of March 2026.

After the revision, a copy of the Roll will be published by the Parochial Church Council, on or near to the principal door of the Parish Church for at least 14 days and a copy of the Roll will be available for inspection on a reasonable request being made to the Council.

Under the Church Representation Rules any lay persons are entitled to have their names entered on the roll if the person is—

- (a) is baptised,
- (b) is aged 16 or over, and
- (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.

The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.

The third declaration is that the person is a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.


Application Forms for enrolment can be obtained from the Church Electoral Roll Officer. In order for a person to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting and to take part in its proceedings, an Application Form for enrolment must be returned by the date shown above for the ending of the revision of the Church Electoral Roll by the Parochial Church Council.

Any error discovered in the Roll should at once be reported to the Church Electoral Roll Officer.

What is a Churchwarden?

St. Edward's Church, continued

The early years of our church were spent under the control of Dieulacresse Abbey. The predominant religion at this time was Roman Catholicism, which was imparted by monks from the abbey. Our first known priest was Peter, who came here in the year 1200. The church then was very different from what we see today. The floor would have been earth, or possibly stone slabs and heating would have been out of the question. Through much of the year therefore, the atmosphere would have been, at best, chilly! To add to the discomfort, there would have been no seating, so the congregation were obliged to stand throughout the services. These were probably quite prolonged and conducted almost entirely in Latin. Often, some local squires, landowners or aristocracy were known to insist that their tenants or serfs attended the services under threat of severe penalties if they failed. This system continued until the Protestant faith was introduced to England by Henry VIII. It is quite likely that some form of seating was introduced around this time, but only for the wealthy and were closely supervised. At some point in the 18th Century, box pews were built. These were again owned by the wealthy, with their names attached and locks on the doors. Over time, these pews were traded, with significant amounts of money changing hands. We still have records of these transactions. The pews we have today were installed during the very significant Victorian restorations of the mid 19th Century. At this time the stone rood loft was removed and replaced by the present wooden screen. Prior to this, the Chancel, according to a contemporary account, was basically derelict and 'open to the elements and the grazing of sheep and cattle'. The account states that the incumbent of the time was responsible for ten parishes between here and Stone, but neglected them because 'he was inordinately fond of his horses, his hounds and his cups'. It must be said that this account cannot be independently verified, but the evidence contained in the stonework gives rise to speculation. Maybe more will come to light at a later date.







The Pointon Park was opened in August 2013 and was developed and financed by the Pointon Family. Following completion, a Charitable Company was formed who took on the responsibility for the day-to-day management and continue to do so. The Park was handed over to the Charity who now have sole ownership of the Facility.

The Charity has a Board of Directors a staff of 4 including a part time centre manager. We have a FA Standard grass football pitch with 2 local teams playing all home games at the Park in addition to some Staffordshire League Finals. We also have a 3G artificial pitch, both pitches have the benefit of floodlighting. Hire charges apply for the use of either pitch.

The Park has the benefit of a children's play area and sand pit, an outdoor gym, running track with a cushioned surface and a boules court and skate board area, all of which are free to use.

We do host the occasional children's birthday party when we open one of our changing rooms for refreshments and allow access to the 3G artificial pitch for children to play ball games, and of course the play equipment is always available. The Park is well served with toilet and changing facilities if required.



What not to say to somebody with dementia

Words can be helpful and uplifting, but also hurtful and frustrating depending on the situation. Here, we look at some words and questions to try to avoid when talking to a person with dementia.

For a person living with dementia, being able to use language and communicate clearly can become more difficult over time. While the person living with the condition may have difficulties finding the right word, the words that other people use are important too.

The type of difficulties a person will face as dementia progresses will be different for each individual, and the type and stage of the person's dementia will also be a factor.

But good communication is key for all our relationships, and can make a difference to our quality of life. Rather than correcting or challenging someone with dementia, considering using these techniques to support your conversations:

8. Try not to talk down to the person: 'I'll just help you use your little spoon there, love?'

'Elderspeak' - which can involve talking in a high-pitched voice, using words like 'love' or 'deary', and generally speaking to the person like they are a child - should be avoided. This can be patronising and infantilising for a person with dementia.

Try this instead:

Always remember the person behind the dementia. It's fine if the person needs you to speak slower than usual, but try to keep your tone of voice the same as with anyone else.

Some people may like being called 'love' or 'dear', but unless you know the person it is usually best to use their name instead. This helps keep their dignity intact.


