

The Church Garden

St Peter's Church Garden is intended to be an oasis in the busy residential area of Monkmoor. Come in ... sit down and relax.


As of 2026 there are three benches in the Garden – donated by the late Brian Ruff, they are there to be used.

It isn't very large, the building of Robertson Way saw to that, but has several parts.

- **The main garden with its 4 small lawns running parallel to Monkmoor Road**
- **The car park**

- The lawn area in front of the Hall
- A small enclosure near the rear with a storage hut – for our ‘Toddle-In’ Preschool group outdoor toys

For the technical - here’s the blueprint



There are two large trees on site – the one between the church and hall is a Holly. The one front right of the church (from Monkmoor Road – facing) is a Cherry, which does have fruit in a good year.

There was an Oak in the middle circle of the 4 small lawns, but it had honey fungus and was replaced with a Rowan tree.

Again, facing the church from Monkmoor Road, the right hand of the 4 small lawns nearest the church is a dedicated area for the (loose) interment of Cremated Remains.

There's a whole lot of information on this interment area which is subject to a Faculty and Regulations issued by the Chancellor of the Diocese of Lichfield. It's the one area where St Peter's has to have a formal policy.... No exceptions to the Chancellor's rules.

The surrounding flower beds have a mixture of flowers and containers with seasonal planting aimed to mix colour, height and fragrance – and to attract pollinators.
