A few years ago I was asked to go and visit a lady going through a very difficult time because of bereavement. While I was with her, I asked her if she would like me to write down some Bible verses that might help her. When I phoned her recently she told me that she had been using them to buoy herself up and to build up her faith. Certainly, I have found it extremely helpful myself to have some Bible verses in my head, so that I can use them at times of difficulty.

After all, Jesus used the Bible as a weapon to help him in his wilderness temptations. Three times he was tempted, we are told, each time he replied, "It is written . . ." He had learned verses from the Jewish scriptures, and he had them in his mind ready to help him at tough times.

What is good enough for Jesus must be good for us too! I remember when I was going through a difficult time several years ago, I got to know a couple of verses so well that it was in my head as I woke up every morning: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end. They are new every morning; great is thy faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23)

I thought it might be appropriate during Lent, to learn a verse each week, and I encourage you to do the same. Maybe you could stick it by a mirror or the telephone to help you to learn it. Then you will have it in your head for if you might need it at a difficult time. I've listed some below, but you may find others in your Bible that are more appropriate to you. Let's be like Jesus and be able to quote helpful scripture!

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1)

"You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You." (Isaiah 26:3)

"So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41:10)

"You are my hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance." (Psalm 32:7-8)

"Be strong and of good courage; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9)

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13)

May God's Word encourage you and strengthen you throughout Lent and in the years to come.



Easy Koulourakia (Traditional Greek Easter Cookies)



In the year 604 Pope Gregory prohibited eating animal products, like dairy and eggs, throughout Lent. Bread eaten during Lent was also commonly unleavened.

That means for Easter we see a lot of fluffy, yeasty, eggy bread, cake and biscuit recipes from across the Christian world.

And who *wouldn't* want to indulge after six weeks of abstinence from all our favourite foods?

Koulourakia are buttery Greek Easter cookies flavoured with orange zest and vanilla. They are shaped by hand into twists, rings, or braids, or even Easter bunnies, as shown here! Why not try these delicious biscuits this Easter.

Ingredients

800 g Plain Flour	2 teaspoons vanilla extract
2 teaspoons baking powder	2 tablespoons cognac (<i>optional</i>)
a pinch of salt	60 ml orange juice
zest from 1 orange	a few whole cloves (<i>1 for each bunny cookie</i>)
300g sugar	<u>For the egg wash</u>
300g unsalted butter, cubed	1 egg yolk
2 eggs	1 teaspoon water
125 ml milk	

Method

Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Set aside. Combine the flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside. In another large bowl, rub the orange zest with the sugar using , then beat on low speed for about a minute. Add the butter and beat on medium-high speed for 10 minutes. The mixture should be light and fluffy. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add the milk, vanilla, orange juice, and cognac (if using) and beat until well combined. Don't worry if it looks curdled, this is normal. Fold in the flour. Use your hands to bring the dough together into a pliable and soft dough. Cover the dough with plastic wrap and let it rest for about half an hour. Preheat the oven to 180 °C . Divide dough, into equal size pieces. Roll each piece into a rope approximately 10 inches. Shape it into your desired design and place on baking sheet at least 5 cm apart. If making bunnies, add the cloves, one for each eye. Make the egg wash: In a small bowl, mix the egg yolk with the water then brush the tops with the wash. Bake in a preheated oven for 20-30 minutes, or until the cookies are a light golden brown. For a crunchier texture, leave them in the oven for an extra 5 minutes. Transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool completely. Store the cookies in an airtight container for up to 2 weeks. **Enjoy!**

St. Edith's Grimoldby. Temporary Nave/Chancel Re-ordering.



On the 1st August 2024 The PCC at St. Edith's church Grimoldby reopened a faculty application from 2019 for the reordering of the nave, a complete new stone floor and removal of the old, defunct organ and heating improvements, with continuous discussions with the DAC since. We are pleased to announce that the DAC have made arrangements for a site visit towards the end of March to iron out some minor issues prior to recommending a faculty approval. We can then obtain costings and apply for grant assistance to carry out the proposed works. In the meantime, like many and most congregations, many of our members now have mobility problems and find it very difficult to access our 3 and 4 steps to our high Altar for Holy Communion. At our recent PCC meeting it was agreed by all to move our Lord's Table to the congregation in the nave, this entailed moving the high altar to the east end of the Nave replacing it with the Altar from our Lady Chapel. We moved our electric piano to the once Lady Chapel in the north aisle and two first pews from the north and south platforms to the rear

Palm Sunday



Palm Sunday is celebrated one week before Easter Day. It marks the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem, an event that is recorded in all four Gospels. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, while the crowds waved palm branches and shouted "Hosanna!" (an exclamation of praise) Palm branches were widely associated with victory and triumph during the time in which Jesus lived. People also laid their cloaks on the ground, a sign of respect and honour for someone of great importance.

To mark this, Palm Sunday is often celebrated with a procession through the streets near a cathedral or church, where congregations carry palm branches or other greenery, sometimes decorated with flowers. Some churches or cathedrals even involve a real donkey in their procession, to mark the role of the animal which carried Jesus. The palm crosses are then often burned to make ashes for the following year's Ash Wednesday service.

Palm Sunday is a time of mixed sentiment because, although triumphal, it precedes the marking of events which led to the arrest and crucifixion of Jesus. It is a time for Christians to reflect on their faith and to prepare themselves for the solemnity of Holy Week, which culminates in the celebration of Easter and the resurrection of Jesus.

of the north platform,
thus giving us existing
front rails to be a new
communion rail.

A tapestry, made by a
unknown member of
our church many years
ago, now adorns the
high altar which also
includes a private prayer
station.

It was whilst moving the
High Altar to the Nave
that we found these
very remarkable floor

tiles which were covered by the Altar table and coated with some
spilt candle wax. This wax has now been removed and the tiles await
some special cleaning. The centre tile shows Jesus as the Lamb of



God with two tiles to either side which are dedicated to Mark,
Matthew, Luke and John. It is believed that the heavy oak table dates
from late Victorian/Edwardian era and is not known how long this
table has been in the high altar position. It is possible that the Lady
Chapel Altar, which is now in its place, originally came from the high
Altar as it now fits perfectly as the High Altar.

The first service since this reordering was our Morning Worship on
the 3rd Sunday of last month and the many worshippers attending
gave their delight and approval to the adjustments made bringing
everyone closer together. Once our faculty has been approved and
the works completed this temporary reordering will then be made
permanent.
