From the Vicar....



No sooner have we celebrated Candlemas - (the presentation of the infant Christ at the temple as required by the law where there is a beautiful encounter with Simeon and Anna) and put the Christmas decorations back into their boxes, than we find ourselves entering the season of Lent and driven out into the wilderness with Jesus.

Lent is the season of preparation leading to Easter. For the early Church, Easter was the principle occasion for baptism and the restoring of those who had been excluded for wrongdoing. This explains the Lenten focus of self-examination, penitence, self-denial and study. Each year the existing Christian community was invited to journey alongside those undergoing preparation, and the season lasting for 40 days reminds us of Jesus' time of preparation and temptation.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday when during our services people can receive an ash cross on their foreheads. The ashes are made from the previous years' palm crosses, and they remind us not only of our own mortality but also of the ashes that people wore as they lamented the sins and woes of the world.

If you don't usually come to church on Ash Wednesday, why not give it a try this year?

You might also set aside a time each day for reading and reflection. There will be some Lenten books available to borrow at the back of church before Lent begins.

Hope House

Last year we welcomed speakers from the Green Pastures Team to speak about the vision for helping people out of homelessness. Green Pastures is a national charity <https://www.greenpastures.co.uk> that invites people to invest with them so that they can buy properties to house vulnerable adults.

The big difference is that each house is supported by volunteers who befriend and assist the residents. The intention is to help them find a place in their community thus breaking the cycle that keeps so many people in poverty and isolation.



Frome Churches have signed up to this vision and the initial required investment of £150K has almost been reached. Each project has to have a local name, and the one in Frome is now known as Hope House.

Last year Christ Church PCC decided to use some of the legacy (£25K) that Eileen Knight had left to invest in this project. You might want to invest as an individual or be willing to volunteer as a befriender.. please keep this vision and the people who it will help, in your prayers in the coming months, and speak to Revd Liz for more information

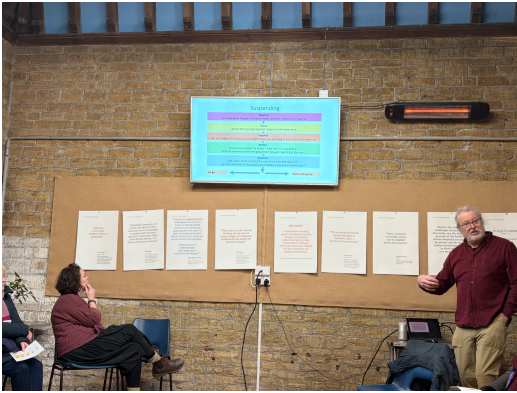


Hall Bookings

We celebrated Epiphany with a delicious lunch after the morning service at St. Mary's

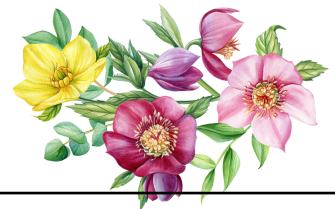
