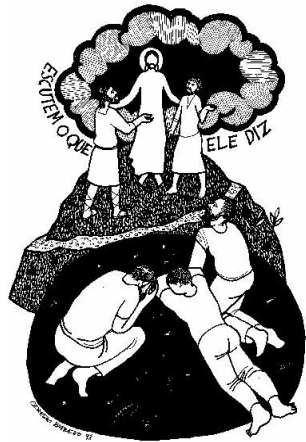

¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

Paschal Candle is lit.

*The parents and Godparents come forward with the candidate for baptism,
Sanayah Omolola Isatu Destiny Olaoye,
to the front of the church and stand before the priest.*

INTRODUCTION TO HOLY BAPTISM

Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven we must be born again of water and the Spirit, and has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth. Here we are washed by the Holy Spirit and made clean. Here we are clothed with Christ, dying to sin that we may live his risen life. As children of God, we have a new dignity and God calls us to fullness of life.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

*The candidate for baptism is brought forward by their parents and godparents,
and they stand before the priest.*

The Priest addresses the whole congregation.

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome *this child*
and uphold *her* in *her* new life in Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

The priest says to the parents and godparents.

Parents and godparents, the Church receives *this child* with joy.

Today we are trusting God for *her* growth in faith.

Will you pray for *her*, draw *her* by your example into the community of faith and walk with *her* in the way of Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism, *this child* begins *her* journey in faith. You speak for *her* today.

Will you care for *her*, and help *her* to take *her* place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

THE DECISION

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

The parents and godparents face WEST (towards the main doors).

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?
I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?
I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?
I repent of them.

The parents and godparents face EAST (towards the High Altar).

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

THE SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

*The priest makes the sign ✠ of the cross
on the forehead of the child with the oil of baptism.*

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign ✠ of the cross. Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

**Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ
against sin, the world and the devil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver ✠ you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

Procession to the Font

THE PRAYER OVER THE WATER

The priest pours water into the font.

Praise God who made heaven and earth,
Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water, you led the children of Israel from slavery to freedom in the promised land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.

By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptise into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

The priest touches the water with his right hand saying:

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, *She* may be cleansed from sin and born again.

Regenerated in your image, may *she* walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

Sisters and brothers,

I ask you to profess together with *this candidate*, the Faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again;
he ascended into heaven,
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?
**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy Catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
✠ and the life everlasting. Amen.**

Celebrant says,

God, the all-powerful Father of our Lord Jesus Christ
has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit,
and forgiven all our sins. May he also keep us faithful
to our Lord Jesus Christ for ever and ever.

THE BAPTISM

The priest pours water on the candidate's head three times and says,

Sanayah Omolola Isatu Destiny.

I baptise you in the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

THE CLOTHING WITH A WHITE GARMENT

A white shawl is placed around the shoulders of the newly baptised.

You have been clothed with Christ.

As many as are baptised into Christ have put on Christ.

ANOINTING WITH CHRISM



*The priest anoints the newly baptised candidate with the oil of Chrism
on her forehead making the Chi-Rho symbol (the first two letters of Christ
in Greek), saying,*

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.**

THE GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

*The priest lights a candle from the Paschal Candle for the newly baptised candidate,
and presents the lighted candle to her.*

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness
and has given us a place with the saints in light.

You have received the light of Christ;
walk in this light all the days of your life.

**Shine as a light in the world
to the glory of God the Father.**

COMMISSION

The priest addresses the congregation.

Sanayah,

Today God has touched you with his love
and given you a place among his people.
God promises to be with you in joy and in sorrow,
to be your guide in life, and to bring you safely to heaven.
In baptism God invites you on a life-long journey.
Together with all God's people you must explore the way
of Jesus Christ and his kingdom,
and grow in friendship with God,
in love for all people, including your enemies,
by seeking justice and peace,
and through the practice of solidarity and serving others,
especially the poor and oppressed.
You will share and participate within the Body of Christ
through word and sacrament.
You will seek the unity of the Church,
and look forward to the day
when Christ shall make all things new.

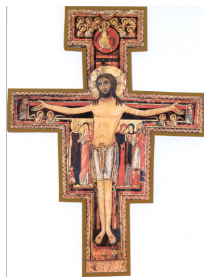

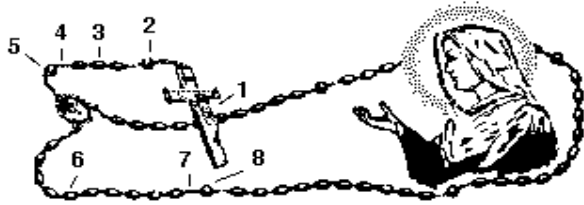

6. Say ten "Hail Mary's," while meditating on the Mystery.
7. Say the "Glory be to the Father."
8. Announce the **Second Mystery**; then say the "Our Father." Repeat 6 & 7 and continue with Third, Fourth & Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.

The Joyful mysteries are said on **Monday and Saturday, Sundays of Advent and after Epiphany until Lent**

1. The Annunciation.
2. The Visitation.
3. The Nativity.
4. The Presentation.
5. The Finding in the Temple.

The Sorrowful on **Tuesday and Friday, Sundays in Lent**

1. The Agony in the Garden.
2. The Scourging at the Pillar.
3. The Crowning with Thorns.
4. The Carrying of the Cross.
5. The Crucifixion.

The Glorious on **Wednesday and Sundays after Easter until Advent**

1. The Resurrection.
2. The Ascension.
3. The Coming of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles.
4. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin.
5. The Coronation of the BVM.

The Luminous on **Thursday, (Suggested by Pope John Paul II)**

1. The Baptism of Christ in the Jordan River.
2. Christ's Self-Manifestation at the Wedding Feast at Cana.
3. Christ's Proclamation of the Kingdom of God with His Call to Conversion.
4. Christ's Transfiguration.
5. Christ's Institution of the Eucharist.

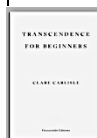

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

'The Lord loves a cheerful giver.'

The Church, based upon biblical teaching, asks every Christian to give a Tithes, 10% of their time, talents & money to God's work, and recommends that members contribute 5% of their income to their church. **E.g. If you earn:**

£5000 a year or, £96 a week = Give £5 a week to S. Paul's.
 £10000 a year, £192 a week = £10 a week. £20000 a year, £385 a week = £20 a week.
 £25000 a year, £480 a week = £25 a week. £30000 a year, £577 a week = £30 a week.
 Over the year our costs run to almost £1,000 a week. We receive no external subsidies, and all monies must be raised from the parishioners, through lettings, or voluntary donations. **Thank you** for all financial contributions which help to pay for: - the: Utility bills of the church, (gas, electricity, water) - Costs of maintaining the worship, (e.g. candles, wine, wafers, incense) - Maintenance, cleaning, & repair of our Grade I Listed church, (substantial costs) - Office costs (e.g. postage, printing, paper) - Monthly Diocesan Parish Share to the Diocese, (80p out of every £1 we give to the Diocese goes towards clergy stipends).

We ask everyone, who can, to please give via Direct Debit, Standing Order, or, via the Weekly Envelope Scheme.
