Sunday 8th February, 2nd Sunday before Lent, and Sunday 15th February, Sunday next before Lent



'The New (Testament) is in the Old concealed; the Old is in the New revealed'. You, like me, might have been brought up with that adage. But it's misleading. There's every bit as much mystery in the NT as there is in the OT. There is a danger in thinking that the OT is old and inferior to the NT.

It's true that Christians know more about God than anyone in the OT could have claimed to know. The supreme idea of God's incarnation exceeds anything to be found in the OT.

But the OT reveals the 'God and father of our Lord Jesus Christ'. Without the OT we would not be able to recognise the revelation of God rendered in Jesus Christ. Moreover, without the OT, the witness of the NT would make little sense.

It's from the OT that we come to know God as Creator of all that is, as the Lord of history, as the Judge who upholds the rights of the poor and downtrodden, of his concern with world politics, his exclusive claim upon his creatures and his relationship to creation.

In an age when culture prefers to speak of a depersonalised, fanciful, immaterial spirituality, as evidenced in Jilly Cooper's recent memorial service, the voice of the concrete, personal, conversational character of the God of the OT is sorely needed.

The Gospels regard major figures of the OT as 'types' for interpreting figures in the NT, so Hannah for Mary; the saga of Joseph, for the father of Jesus, Elijah as John the Baptist. And notice when we come to the first four Sundays in Lent how in St Paul's letter to the Romans he uses the OT figures Adam, Abraham and Moses as 'types' to fill out the life and teaching of Jesus.

If the two newly restored rose windows of Notre-Dame de Paris are representative of the darker hues of the OT, on the one side, and the brighter lights of the NT, on the opposite side, they should teach us that, for the Christian, both OT and NT are required reading.
