


## From the Vicarage

Dear Friends and Neighbours,

In February I often gaze out of the sitting room window onto the garden. I try to imagine the cold dark earth being transformed by the incoming spring's warmth back into riotous colour. For now we are very much in the grip of winter, but while the nights are still a bit too long, hope rises again with the first of the snowdrops, heralds of the glories to come. These are the chilly in-between days, but there is still much in our parishes to warm our hearts.



First off we have Pancake Day on Shrove Tuesday, with its simple but joyful pleasures. I wonder what your favourite toppings are; do you go for sugar and lemon, butter and maple syrup, banana and nutella, or something savoury? In my family, true to our northern roots, only golden syrup would do. As an adult I experimented with more sophisticated alternatives but they just didn't hit the spot. Nothing else gives me that same feel good nostalgia rush, and in a time of food inflation a pocket friendly one too.

Of course Shrove Tuesday heralds Ash Wednesday just as the snowdrops herald the spring. I find the Ash Wednesday service with its imposition of ashes one of the most dramatic and meaningful of the church year. To come forward and have a blackened cross of ashes smeared on your forehead is a powerful symbol of faith. It marks the beginning of Lent and the long walk Jesus made to the cross. Traditionally it's a time for giving things up, often chocolate or alcohol. There's no doubt that there's value in this, but I can't help feeling that at this time adding something spiritually nourishing to our daily lives might bring about a greater good.

Perhaps in Lent 2026, amid the clamour of the world, we could practise forty days of small, quiet kindnesses. This might include making time to call an old friend, checking in on a neighbour who lives alone, or simply making time each morning to pray or sit in silence resting in the presence of God. Many of us live at such a pace that the greatest gift we can give ourselves, and those around us, is permission to slow down. The modern cult of busyness is not the work of God. Therefore this Lent I challenge you to turn to Christ and breathe...

## Organ and Sound Update

I am pleased to report that work has started on the organ renovation and repairs. Lance Foy Organ Builders have braved the journey from Truro three times since the New Year and are making good progress. Each time leaving the organ loft tidy and the organ still being playable. I was actually able to walk behind the organ for the first time and see the beautiful stained glass window that sits behind it.

They are due to return for another two visits and will bring an electrician. This will enable them to put lights within the organ that can be turned on to aid tuning and work inside the organ and update all the electrics for it. At the same time we are hoping that the electrician will be able to re-install back lighting for the west window (which had fallen into disrepair as it could not be accessed) so the beautiful window can be viewed at night.

We are making progress with the new sound system and have visited two churches to listen to their systems and have two further visits planned. It is very important that we make the right decision on which music system and speakers we use, so are taking our time rather than rushing. It is not an easy area and the galleries add a further complexity to it. After all the effort that has gone into the fund raising, it is important that we get it right.

## 2025 Christmas Charities

Thank you to everyone who donated towards the 2025 Christmas Charities. Money raised at the Community Christmas Tree Lighting, Coffee Morning and Christmas Services totalled £998.41. ## Generations growing in faith together

Our extended family recently got together for a celebration. We were nine adults from 24-68, one toddler, and one dog, and it was glorious! The joy was simply in being together, whatever our age.

I sometimes wonder what would happen in the life of our churches if we could adopt the same outlook there? Each generation glad that the other is there. Each generation contributing something to the whole. Each generation looking to the interests of the others, making sure there was something that spoke to the others even if not to them.

The writer of the Chronicles records something you could miss if you weren't looking for it. In 2 Chronicles 20, when Judah was facing attack from Ammon and Moab, King Jehoshaphat proclaimed a fast and summoned the people. This is what it says in verse 13:

"All Judah stood before the Lord, with their little ones, their wives, and their children."

At a time of great peril, when the king was seeking the LORD, all generations came together to pray.

We often think of intergenerational meaning us older ones passing on wisdom to the younger ones, and that's certainly part of it. The Christmas season is over and the Crib Figures are carefully packed away for another year. We are into Ordinary Time and our young people are well into preparation classes for their First Holy Communion at Easter. They meet on Wednesday afternoons, after school, and Fr Mark has arranged to combine this with a weekday Mass at 5pm instead of Thursday mornings as previously.

In 2024 the Catholic Bishops of England, Wales and Scotland announced minor revisions to the Readings at Mass. This change primarily involved the use of a new, mandatory translation of the scriptures, not a revision of the Order of Mass itself. Frustratingly we were obliged to renew all but one of the six sets of a hundred Mass books used by the congregation each week. All is not wasted though; one clever idea has been to bundle them into individual sets for distribution to the sick and housebound who are unable to attend Mass, or anyone wishing to have the text at home. Anyone visiting the church recently will have noticed a new feature just inside the entrance. Now that card payments have generally taken over from real cash, we have at last embraced this trend and installed a Dona card payment machine. This can receive cashless payment for donations and sales from our cupboard of devotional goods. Cash is still very acceptable though!

This is going to be an increasing part of our deliveries.

I shall be making deliveries to Baby Basics in Illminster this month, I supply them with knitted baby blankets and first and second size baby jackets. They are now asking for bootees and mittens BUT NOT HATS! All colours acceptable but not pure wool.


