entertain. There are several other events in here that will work for children and adults — do have a look, and send us a paragraph of write-up and a photo if you do go to something good.

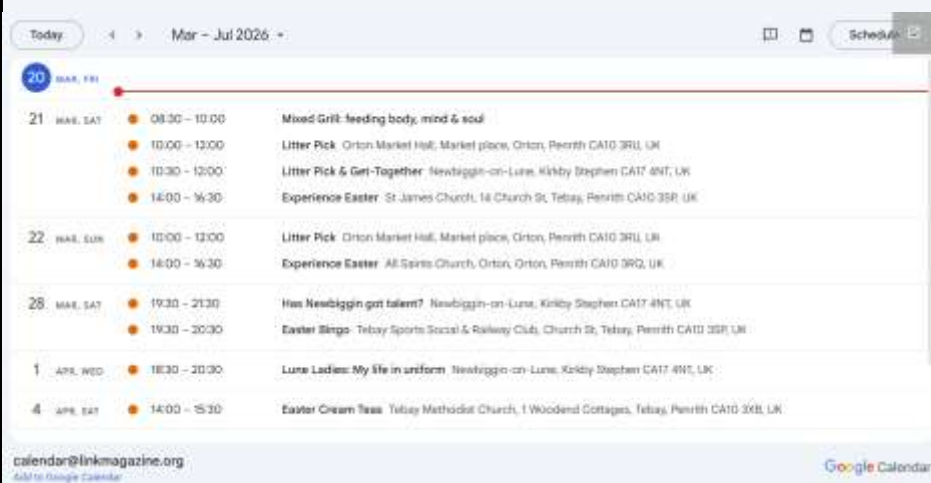

The Resurrection & The Life

Dear Friends,

'I am the resurrection and the life,' says the Lord. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die.'

These words from John 11:25-26 are the first words spoken at every funeral service. They are quite a statement; setting every funeral in the context not just of eternity but the life and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Many other words are spoken at funeral services, but the first words set the scene, they frame the service, and hold the congregation. They are words of comfort and hope.

In their original setting in John's gospel, Jesus speaks these words to his friend Martha on the death of her brother Lazarus.

They are words spoken at a time of loss and grief. 'If only you had been there he would not have died', Martha sharply replies to Jesus. Then we have a picture of these words in action as Lazarus is raised from the dead by Jesus. A foretaste of Jesus' own resurrection on Easter Day.

The point Jesus is making to Martha, and the hope being shared with us, is that Jesus' resurrection changes everything... even death. This is what Easter is all about. 'Nothing', to use the words of St Paul, 'can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus'.

With the suffering of war, and the effects of evil power struggles all around us, we are painfully aware of the brokenness of our world. The world is in a desperate mess, and we may be tempted to despair.

Easter, the resurrection of Jesus, however assures us that evil, which on Good Friday did its utmost to extinguish the light of God's love in Jesus, will not triumph.

And what is true on the cosmic scale, is true also in our own lives, 'though I walk in the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil', the Psalmist writes.

Easter doesn't mean that we won't face the darkness of Good

Friday, far from it. None of us is immune to the sufferings of this life. It does, however, mean that the darkness will not have the last word.

For Christians the words of Jesus, 'I am the resurrection and the life' is both the first and last word.

With every blessing for this Easter season.

Women Artists in Britain 1520 – 1920

For their March meeting Appleby Arts Society welcomed Dr Amy Lin. Amy is an art historian and curator, specialising in British fine and decorative arts from the seventeenth to the twentieth centuries. Every work of art has the potential to tell a story: about the people who made, bought and owned it, and the society in which they lived.

Levina Teerlinc (1510 –1576)

was a Flemish Renaissance [miniaturist](#) who served as a [painter to the English court](#) of [Henry VIII](#), [Edward VI](#), [Mary I](#) and [Elizabeth I](#).



She was the most important miniaturist at the English court between Hans Holbein the Younger and Nicholas Hilliard. Her father was a renowned book [illuminator](#) and [miniature](#) painter of the [Ghent-Bruges school](#) and trained her as a [manuscript painter](#).

The first British artist to be recognised was Mary Beale (1633-1699) who supported her family through her work as an artist, primarily as a [portraitist](#). Beale's clientele included her immediate circle of friends, nobility, landed gentry, and clergymen. Her husband, Charles, prepared her canvases and paints, purchased supplies, handled accounts, and kept detailed [notebooks about his wife's daily work](#). The Baroque painter Artemisia Gentileschi is considered the most accomplished 17th century artist. When she came to England her artistic style developed further. She became famous for her historical paintings, which was revolutionary for a woman at the time; other women artists tended to focus on genre or portraiture paintings. During her time in Britain she sold seven paintings including her famous work, *Susanna and the Elders* 1638-40, which is in the Royal Collection, having been bought by Queen Henrietta.

Angelica Kauffman was a Swiss painter who had a successful career in London and Rome and was known as skilled [portraitist](#) and [landscape](#) painter. Her father was a skilled Austrian muralist and painter who trained Angelica, and she worked as his assistant moving through Switzerland, Austria, and Italy. Angelica was a talented singer and musician and, forced to choose between opera and art, she chose art. She was, along with [Mary Moser](#), one of two female painters among the [founding members](#) of the [Royal Academy of Art](#) in London in 1768.

Elizabeth Southerden Thompson (later Lady Butler) was a British painter who specialised in

painting scenes from British military campaigns and battles, including the [Crimean War](#) and the [Napoleonic Wars](#). She wrote about her military paintings in an autobiography published in 1922: "I never painted for the glory of war, but to portray its [pathos](#) and heroism." Her most notable work was the painting [The Roll Call](#), which depicted a line of soldiers worn out with conflict. It was shown in 1874 at the Royal Academy [Summer Exhibition](#) and when it went on public display, was mobbed by crowds because it had shown the ordinary soldier as the hero. It was later bought by Queen Victoria for £100.

Helen Allingham (1848 – 1926)

Helen Allingham is one of the best known Victorian painters in watercolours and one of the most successful female British artists ever. She studied art in Birmingham and the Royal Female School of Art in London before turning to watercolours. Her country gardens and cottages were incredibly popular with the public. After the death of her husband in 1889 she continued to support her family by painting constantly, even when her work went out of fashion in the early twentieth century. She continued to paint country cottages for the new urban middle class in London who had become detached from their country roots, and loved these pictures. She was an artist of great skill and it is thought that she painted over 1,000 pictures. The year 1920 was a transition point – women were given a franchise and therefore could work. The April 8th lecture, is 'Chinese Imperial Court Costume'.

TEBAY AND ORTON WI



David Barker was our guest speaker
for our February meeting. After our
usual soup and sandwich lunch, he
presented his talk entitled "The Origins and Early
History of the Ordnance Survey".

David's interest in maps began as a schoolboy,
whilst on a trip to the Lake District. This interest
persisted into adulthood and following his
training as a draughtsman, he became a
surveyor for the Ordnance Survey, based in
Southampton.

The need for accurate maps of the Scottish
Highlands was recognised by the British military
after the Jacobite rebellion, and, in 1747,
William Roy was charged with the task of
surveying the area for the purpose of military
defence. It took eight years to complete the
survey using a scale of 131/4" to one mile.

The Ordnance Survey was founded in 1791, and
in 1801 the first map produced to the scale of
1" to one statute mile, was of the county of
Kent. During WW1, Ordnance Survey pioneered
aerial photography which assisted in creating
tactical maps for military operations. In 1935, a
new survey of Britain began and the National
Grid was introduced, where each square
represented 100km sq. Between the 1960's and
70's, the 1:50,000 scale map was introduced.
This survey took 40 years to complete. Today,
the Ordnance Survey operates as a
government owned company which provides
digital and paper maps for navigating,
surveying and planning.

David's talk was interesting and informative,
and we all felt that we had learnt something.
With new technology, to some it would seem
that digital maps are the only means of
navigation, but for those of us who have grown
up with Ordnance Survey maps, there is nothing
better than poring over a paper map when
planning a route across the fells.

Save Junction 38

As of February 2026, National Highways is facing intense pressure over planned 4-year, partially-closed, overnight/weekend maintenance works for the M6 Junction 38 (Tebay) to replace Lune Gorge bridges, starting in 2027.

Local businesses and MP Tim Farron have petitioned against this, citing "devastating" economic impacts on Tebay Services and surrounding areas, demanding temporary slip roads.

Junction 38 & M6 Key Updates:

- ❁ Controversial Closures: The 4-year project to rebuild bridges is expected to disrupt traffic, with concerns it could isolate Kirkby Stephen.
- ❁ Petition Handed In: In late January 2026, a petition was delivered to 10 Downing Street calling for changes to the plans.
- ❁ Independent Advice: Local residents engaged an engineering firm that suggested the work can be done while keeping the junction fully open, a proposal currently under review after initial rejection by National Highways.
- ❁ Project Timeline: Main work is scheduled to begin in 2027, with efforts ongoing to limit impact.
- ❁ Local Action: Westmorland and Furness Council has formally pressured National Highways to find a solution that keeps the junction accessible.

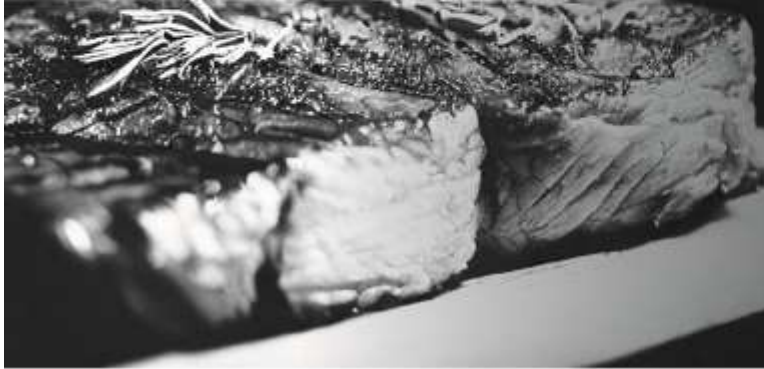

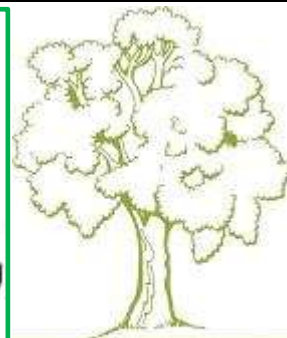


